Miss Flanagan is the daughter of Mr. and Mrs. Peter V. Flanagan, Rochester, and is a graduate of Nazareth Academy, where she was a member of Our Lady's Sodality, the Science Club, the National Honor Society, Quill and Scroll and served on the staff of the "Gabriel," student publication.

ACTIVE IN MANY affairs at Nazareth College, Miss Flanagan is a member of the National Federation of Catholic College students and has served as junior and alternate delegate to this body. Spiritual Lay Leadership Urged On 500 At Meet

Niagara University, N. Y. — "America is a free country because we still observe the spiritual foundation of our democracy as it was understood by our Founding Fathers when they wrote the Declaration of Independence," David V. Sheehan, field representative of the Kirby Foundation, Washington, D. C., declared Friday, as he delivered the main address at the regional congress of the National Federation of Catholic College students held at Niagara University.

"Many men today ignore this spiritual basis for democracy," Mr. Sheehan said, "but the Founding Fathers were most specific in asserting that this was the only basis upon which good government could be built."

"SOME SCHOOLS" of philosophy," he stated, "would uphold the validity and force of the Bill of Rights and the Constitution, but at the same time would deny the spiritual basis of the declaration which brought them into existence. To deny these to God," he admonished, "is to hand them over to the dictatorships of men."

"As a result," he continued, "the threat of ignorance, complacency and secularism to the democracy of the Founding Fathers, while less evident than that of communism, is none the less more dangerous. The spiritual foundation of democracy is jeopardized more by neglect and denial," he warned, "than by the acknowledged opposition of communism."

Mr. Sheehan explained that the Kirby Foundation was established to preserve and spread the spiritual precepts upon which the foundation of our country rests and encouraged the members of the regional federation to develop a deeply spiritual lay leadership to help save the United States from complete secularism.

Other speakers on the agenda included His Excellency Bishop Kearney of Rochester, who presided and the Very Rev. Francis L. Meade, C.M., president of Niagara University, who delivered the welcoming address to the more than 500 delegates.
