New Rochelle, N. Y. (RNS)—Chaplain (Col.) Joseph R. Koch, Commandant of the Chaplain School at Fort Slocum near here, and senior Catholic chaplain in the armed forces, marked his 25th year as a U. S. Army chaplain on March 30.

Commissioned in the Chaplains Corps on March 30, 1928, Msgr. Koch has served in U. S. Army hospitals and in the Philippine Islands on several tours of duty.

Under Chaplain Koch's guidance, the Chaplain School has gained both national and international prestige.
