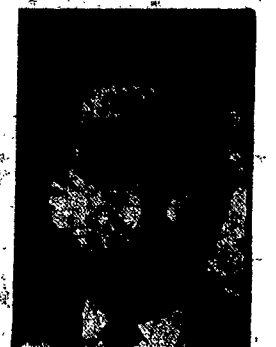


Genevan Passes N.Y. State Engineer Exam
