Fishing Contest In 8th Year Set

Louis A. Wehle, New York State Fishing Contest will be conducted for the eighth year in 1933, according to Wehle.

This contest has increased in size and popularity each year since it first began in 1926. The contest will be open to all residents of New York State and only fish taken in waters within the state will be eligible. There are twelve different species of fish which may be entered. They must be taken on rod and reel during legal open season between April 1 and October 31 inclusive.

Monthly prizes numbering 198, grand prizes \$5 and guides' prizes 12 - a total of 245 cash prizes will be awarded amounting to \$5,135.00. First, second and third prizes of \$20.00, \$15.00 and \$10.00 respectively for the largest fish in each species every month. Grand prizes of \$60.00, \$35.00 and \$25.00 will be awarded for the largest fish in each species to be entered throughout the year.

Good Friday Bill
Topeka, Kan. - (RNS) - A bill to designate Good Friday a legal holiday in Kansas has been introduced in the state legislature here.

(Similar measures are pending in the New York and North Carolina legislatures. Thirteen states this year will observe a legal holiday on April 3, while in California the hours from noon to 3 p.m. have been set aside for Good Friday observance by legislative action.)

Religion in Schools Urged By Bp. Foery Of Syracuse

Syracuse, N. Y. - (RNS) - The American tradition is not complete separation of education and religion but rather that moral and religious instruction properly belong in the schools, Bishop Walter A. Foery of Syracuse said here.

He made this statement at a dinner honoring him for "accomplishments in the field of education" during his 15 years as Bishop of the diocese. The dinner was sponsored by the Tipperary Hill Post of the American Legion.

THE FIRST Amendment to the Constitution was not adopted because its framers were hostile to religion, Bishop Foery said. He stressed that they were, in fact, religious men soundly educated in religious schools.

"Not only the public officials but the rank and file of the American colonists well realized that religion is not something in a vacuum," the Bishop said. "They were deeply convinced that religion is something that penetrates the whole area of life's experience, that religion concerns itself with the interests and activities of daily experience, and is involved in every decision of a practical nature throughout the entire day."

"There, religion should be an essential part of the curriculum of every educational system," he said. "Hence religious education is the genuine American education. It is the original American way of life."
