Penn Yan Holy Week Rites List Padre Of Guadalcanal

Penn Yan — The Rev. Frederic P. Gehring, C.M., a Vincentian Father, and the "Padre of Guadalcanal," is conducting Holy Week services at St. Michael's Church, which opened on Wednesday.

Announcement of the visit here of Father Gehring was made by the Rev. Francis Waterstraat, pastor of St. Michael's who also spent several months in the Pacific as a chaplain in World War Two.

FATHER GERHING enlisted as a lieutenant in the US Navy Reserve and was assigned to Pacific duty. He was attached to a Navy establishment on Guadalcanal and served as chaplain with the First Marine Division during the six months when the world expected Guadalcanal to be another Bataan. By his zeal and untiring efforts with the U. S. fighting men he earned his title of "The Padre of Guadalcanal."

In 1945 he was senior Catholic chaplain at US Naval Training Center at Sampson and in that center he met and looked after thousands of boys who had their boot training there.

His care of Patsy Li, little 5-year-old Chinese waif rescued after being cruelly beaten by Japs and with 57 bayonet wounds in her body is one of the war's great human interest stories. He also directed the rescue of 28 missionaries from behind Jap lines assisted by a handful of faithful natives.

A delegation from the Fourth Degree Assembly in uniform under the direction of Faithful Navigator Gerald F. Mullen acted as guard of honor at the church services.

George B. Shamon, past grand knight, was toastmaster at the breakfast which followed at Osborne Hotel. Guest speaker was Prof. John W. McDonald of Cornell University Law School.

PROFESSOR McDonald said in part: "Privilege against self-incrimination as contained in the Bill of Rights makes impossible in the United States a Mind-szenty or a Stepinac. From that privilege comes the assurance that when we hear a knock on the door at night, we know it is a friendly one."

District Deputy Avery E. Neagle spoke briefly on the program of the Knights of Columbus. He informed his hearers that there are 100,000 under instruction by mail in the K. of C. Catholic Information correspondence course; that the Knights are subsidizing the micro filming of the Vatican Library; that there is to be a \$1,000,000 education and scholarship fund for the children of Knights of Columbus killed in service; that there is a fifty bed wing at St. Gabriel's Hospital for tubercular patients in the Adirondacks for the use of members in good standing. The District Deputy also spoke in praise to the organization's insurance plan.
