### Fr. Murphy Heard By 600 Knights

"Be bearers of Christ," the Very Rev. John F. Murphy, C.S.B., president of St. John Fisher College told 600 Knights of Columbus at the Triple Cities Council Communion Breakfast, March 29 in St. James Hall, Johnson City.

Father Murphy talked on "The Truths By Which We Live." He challenged his audience as Knights of Christopher Columbus to be bearers of Christ.

"You bear the name of Columbus with dignity, with reverence and pride," the Basilian educator said. "An intrepid explorer, anxious to push back the horizons for men, he was not content to rest in smug complacency. His Christian name was Christopher, which means 'Christ-bearer.'"

"That is the challenge I beg you to accept — be bearers of Christ into your homes, your offices, your factories — so that your eloquent example may draw countless souls closer to the feet of Jesus Christ."
