PFC Gordon Allen Gives Life In Korean Action

A serviceman who attended St. Charles Borromeo School has given his life on the battlefields of Korea, his parents were informed last week.

Pfc. Gordon R. Allen, 19, of 465 South Dr., Greece was killed in action in Korea, according to a Defense Department telegram received by his parents, Mr. and Mrs. Jack L. Allen.

WORD OF their soldier son's death reached Mr. and Mrs. Allen the day after Pfc. Allen had written home to his 8-year-old brother, Michael.

Pfc. Allen had been in Korea seven months, fighting as a recoilless rifle gunner. He was

awarded the Combat Infantryman's Badge last Fall while with the Eighth Army.

Pfc. Allen was nearly three years in service. He had taken paratroop training in this country prior to going to Korea.

Keenly interested in baseball, young Allen played with several area amateur teams before entering the Army. He also attended Charlotte High School and later worked for Star Super Markets.

Besides his parents and brother, Michael, he is survived by three sisters, Mrs. Evelyn Pollentier of Colorado Springs; Carol, 13, and Janet, 3.
