Born in Honduras, Jan. 26, 1917, Father Joyce is the son of Mr. and Mrs. E. P. Joyce of Spartanburg, S.C. He was named executive vice president of the University of Notre Dame on June 27, 1952.

AFTER GRADUATING from Notre Dame in 1937 he was associated with the L. C. Dodge accounting firm in Spartanburg. He became a certified public accountant in 1939. He entered the seminary of Holy Cross College, Catholic University of America, in 1945 and was ordained a priest of the Congregation of the Holy Cross on June 3, 1949.
