As each era of civilization dies, it persecutes, and in the midst of that persecution Christ says to us as to the disciples of Emmanuel: "Ought not the Son of Man to suffer in order to enter into His glory?" The great difference between the Church and the secular civilizations is the Church has the power of self-renewal, civilization such as Babylon exhausts itself, it leaves the face of the earth forever. No civilization ever perished and rose again. But the Church can come out of the grave, or apparently being defeated by an age, can become suddenly victorious, as the gates of Hell fall to prevail against it.

The Church has often been "killed": with the Arians and Alogians heretics, the "French Revolution," and now with Communism in China and the Iron Curtain. But it will be the Church that buries the age. The Church is not being killed; but being pushed into the bowels of the earth where it is digging catacombs, and one day it will come out to reconquer the earth. If we are now going into the catacombs, it is as Christ went into the grave. The world might just as well expect to see Him miraculously restored, as they might look for the rising of a star, for "Heaven and earth shall pass away, but my Word shall not pass away."

It may be that persecution places the Church psychologically in a more favorable position for revealing its true nature than ever before.

We must personalize this "defeat" of Easter by defeating our own egotisms and selfishness. This is done by sacrificing something—an increase in salary or a luxury, that some poor soul in India or Africa may share our faith in Christ and His Blessed Mother.

Mills Bros. Circus To Show In Newark For K.C. Benefit
