Miss Murnighan, daughter of Mr. and Mrs. R. H. Murnighan, 239 Alpine Drive, Rochester, spent her seven weeks in Overbrook Town Shop in Scranton, acquiring experience in commercial dietetics. In contrast to the other two, Miss Murnighan's time was spent mainly in food preparation. She took her turn at the range, in vegetable preparation, salad arrangements, helping the baker and the other tasks of a commercial kitchen. While she was there she assisted the dietitian in a study of the combinations of foods people order when they go out to eat.

The placing of these three Rochester young women was a part of a plan whereby Marywood seeks to ease the students' progress from college to career. It gives the Marywoodians a chance to put theory into practice, to try their hands at their chosen fields, and to close their period of academic training with a period of supervised practical application. All three young women will receive their degree of bachelor of science in home economics in the Marywood May Commencement. Majors in Foods and Nutrition, they have already applied at hospitals of their choice for a year's dietetic internship.
