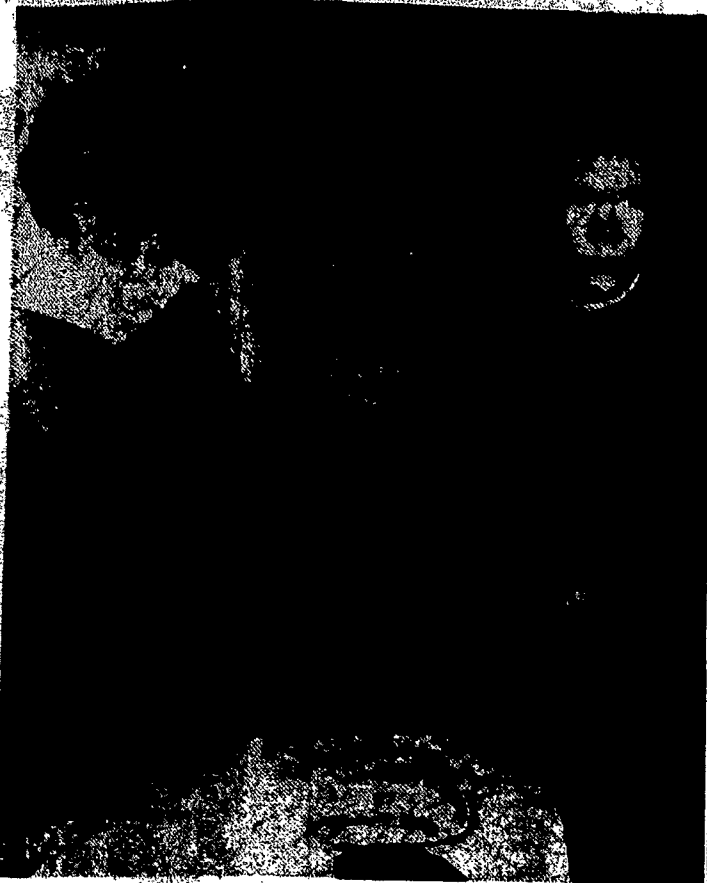

Friends, neighbors and relatives often join the family in the recitation of the Family Rosary. Each guest is to receive a little prayer card entitled: "Prayer for the Family Rosary," as a souvenir of the visit.

This prayer, with the signature of Cardinal Spellman, is as follows:

O Queen of Peace, it is You Who have placed the Rosary in our hands. It is You Who bid us to recite it daily. By the power of the Family Rosary, we beseech You to obtain peace for us — peace within our hearts, our homes, our country and throughout the world. Through the daily recitation of the Family Rosary, we beg You to keep us from our sinful enemies, from our hearts, and war from our shores. By the grace received from the devotion of the Family Rosary, we pray to be made helpful to one another in following the paths of virtue, so that we may be found worthy to be called children of Your family, children of Your home, Amen.

First Haiti Native Elevated To Bishop

Paris — (RNS) — Msgr. Remy Augustin of the Montfortian Order has been named Titular Bishop of Tunuzi and Auxiliary to Archbishop Giuseppe LeGouaze of Port-au-Prince, Haiti, by Pope Pius XII.

Bishop-elect Augustin, 43, is the first native Haitian to be elevated to the episcopacy. Ordained a secular priest, he joined the Montfortian Order in 1947 and has since worked in Port de Paix.

Successful Reformatory Mission Is 31st Annual

Another successful Mission, the 31st annual, at Elmira Reformatory was conducted in the Don Bosco Chapel by the Rev. Daniel Hunt, C.P., Passionist missionary. The Chapel was filled to capacity at all services.

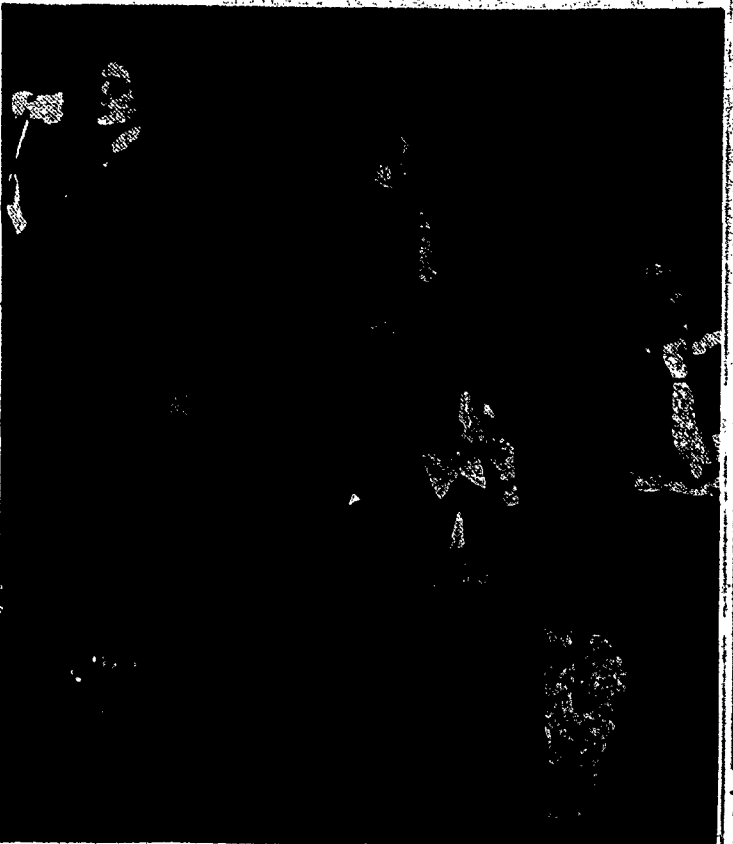
The response of the Reformatory's inmates to the Mission was indicated by the fact that more than 1500 Holy Communions were distributed and more than 750 Confessions heard, according to Don Bosco Bulletin, the Catholic newspaper of the population.

SERMONS WERE on these topics: "Keeping God's Laws," "The Second, Fourth and Eighth Commandments," "Be Prepared For Death," and "Devotion to Mary, our Mother." Services consisted of Recitation of the Rosary, Sermons and Benediction of the Blessed Sacrament.

The Mission is a continuation of services inaugurated by the Rt. Rev. Msgr. Francis J. Lane, Chaplain at the Reformatory, 31 years ago. The Bulletin prepared by the inmates said: "A word of thanks is appropriate at this time to Father Daniel, the visiting priests who heard the confessions, the choir for their beautiful singing of the hymns under the direction of Mr. Thomas, the men that attended

the Mission and made it the success that it was and last but not least, our own Monsignor Lane, who inaugurated the first Mission 31 years ago, and has continued to make the Mission and many other religious services possible for us. "So we take this time Father, to despatch our earnest thanks to you, for enabling us to behold these wonderful services. May next year's Mission be an even greater success."
