### Monsignor Boland in Africa Visits Fr. Erb's Church

Accra, Gold Coast, Africa—(Radio, NC)—Magr. John P. Boland of Buffalo, N. Y., paid warm tribute here to the "very progressive" missionary work of the Society of the Divine Word in the Accra diocese.

Monsignor Boland, labor relations expert and one of the original members of the National Labor Relations Board set up by President Roosevelt in 1934, was in Accra on his way home from Sydney, Australia, where he took part in a National Eucharistic Congress.

"I glory to see the development of the very progressive mission of the Accra diocese," Monsignor Boland declared. "Backing a church building program, I note a solid plan for Catholic schools."

Monsignor Boland, who previously stopped off for visits in New Zealand and Hawaii, said he was "highly impressed" by the "tireless efforts both of the Divine Word Fathers and Brothers and of the Sisters of the Servants of the Holy Ghost." He paid special tribute to the missionaries' modern approach to their work through Catholic Action programs and the media of the press and films.

THE MONSIGNOR preached at the Church of Christ the King, where the pastor is Father Charles G. Erb, S.V.D., originally from the Rochester, N. Y., Diocese, and at Holy Family Church in Accra, where he was greeted by Father Charles Schneider, S.V.D., who hails from the Buffalo Diocese.

The American prelate arrived at the Gold Coast as Catholics of the Accra diocese were observing a day of prayer for their new Negro Ordinary, Bishop Joseph Oliver Bowers, S.V.D., who was being consecrated by His Eminence Francis Cardinal Spellman, Archbishop of New York. The consecration took place at Bay St. Louis, Mississippi, headquarters of St. Augustine's Seminary, of which the new Bishop is an alumnus.
