Nazareth Academy Lists Noted Concert Organist

William Watkins, concert organist from Washington, D. C., will play an organ recital at Nazareth Academy on Thursday, May 7, at 8:30 p.m.

Mr. Watkins was declared winner of the Young Artists Award of \$1,000 in the competition held in 1949 by the National Federation of Music Clubs. Since then he has toured the country extensively, playing recitals and making orchestral appearances in a long list of major cities.

Watkins has been described by newspaper critics as "one of the great interpretive artists of the century," "dazzling in the extreme," "one of the greatest organists of our times." Born in Virginia, he is a graduate of the Peabody Conservatory of Baltimore, where he received the rarely-given Artist Diploma in organ, the 18th such diploma awarded since 1882.
