Joining the 47-year-old Rector of the Cathedral as a new link in the unbroken chain of Apostolic succession, which is the continuation of the role of Christ's Apostles in the person of the Church's Bishops, will be His Eminence Francis Cardinal Spellman, Archbishop of New York, who will act as

The Most Rev. James E. Kearney, Bishop of Rochester, will preach the sermon during the consecration ceremony which will begin at 10 a.m. The new Bishop-Elect served as Bishop Kearney's secretary from 1937 to 1946, The procession of church dignitaries, religious and dio-

Last consecration of a bishop held in Rochester was 16 years ago when the Rev. Walter A. Foery, then pastor of Holy Rosary Church, was consecrated Bishop of Syracuse on August 18, 1937 in the old St. Patrick's Cathedral. He will act as a co-consecrator for Bishop Casey.

Next Tuesday Bishop Casey will kneel at the same altar before which he was ordained 23 years ago in the old St. Patrick's Cathedral. The altar was moved to the Sacred Heart Church when St. Patrick's was razed.

The linen cloth which will be used when Bishop Casey is anointed during the consecration ceremony will be the same one used for Bishop Kearney's consecration in New York's St. Patrick Cathedral in 1932.
