very ernate, is wern en facet days; the less ernate mitre, during Advent and Lent; and the simple mitre, lacking ernament, on Good Friday, atfunerals and in the presence of the Ebly Father;

The Crosier, or the bishop's pesteral staff, is a symbol of his autherity and jurisdiction. It is a very senate staff made of gold and set with jewels, gracefully crooked at the top. (The pastoral staff of the Holy Father is straight, surmounted by a cross; the crook in the bishop's staff is meant to show his submission to the authority of the Pope.)

The Crosier has been used by bishess since the fifth century. Like the mitre, it, too, is conferred on the bishop at the rite of consecration and is used at all solemn pontifical functions.

The Pectoral Cross is the latest addition to the insignia of the bishop. It is made of some precious metal, ersamented with diamonds, pearls, and other precious gems and is worn at the breast suspended on a chain or silken cord. Frequently containing

relics of the saints and a particle of the true Cross, the Pectoral Cross is a constant reminder to the bishop of the Passion of our Lord Jesus Christ and the triumphs of the faith.

The Pallium, which had its origin probably in the fourth century, is an ecclesiastical ornament conferred onby on archbishops. It is a circular cloth band about two inches wide worn over the shoulders above the chasuble. It may be worn only in the archbishop's own diocese and on great feasts of the Church or on such accasions as Ordination ceremonies. To the Pallium are attached two cioth pendants, one at the front, another at the back. The pendants are weighted with lead and covered with black silk, while the remainder of the Pallium is composed of white weel. Every pallium is fashioned from the wool of a lamb blessed every year on the feast of St. Agnes, Janmany 21, in the Lateran Basilica in Boine. On the pallium are six small black creases, one on each pendent, on the breast and tack, and on each shoulder, Blessed on the feasts of Min Peter and Paul, the pallium is a symbol of the archbishop's participation in the supreme pastoral power.
