**Home From Canada Mission Oblate Brother Asks Truck**

Brother Carl needs a truck! In the wild and broad expanse of Canadian prairie of Saskatchewan, a truck is a "must" to the Oblate missionary. So Brother Carl is making an appeal to the Aquinas Mission Unit of his alma mater to replace this much needed piece of equipment destroyed by last year's floods.

Brother Carl Breaky, O.M.I., is in Rochester for a few weeks' vacation at the home of his parents, Mr. and Mrs. E. J. Breaky, 649 Burr St.

Brother Carl studied for three years at Aquinas Institute, then entered the Oblate community at Littlefield, Sask. in Canada on Sep. 29, 1951. After a six-month postulancy and a year of novitiate, he took temporary vows in the order on Mar. 19, 1952.

OF THE 94 BROTHERS in St. Mary's Province of the Oblates, which covers a territory extending from Vancouver to Ontario, Brother Carl is the only American.

Besides Canadians, there are many Europeans in the community, while in Brother Carl's class, one of the novices was a full-blooded Indian from the Yukon territory, one of the extensive districts of the North under Oblate care.

The work of the Oblate Brothers is designed to further the apostolate, especially among the Indians and half-breeds of the Northwest. Farm work, manual labor of all sorts, technical work in the trades, mechanics and assisting the Oblate priests in their missionary functions make up the particular work of the Brother.

This is Brother Carl's first visit home since his entrance into the Oblates. The other Br. of Holy Rosary parish include Brother's three sisters: Joyce, a student at Brockport Normal School, and Patricia and Maryann, who both attend Nazareth Academy.

Brother Carl, a handsome and well-built young man of 21, will return to the mission field in two weeks.

**Indian Officials Warn Missionaries**

New Delhi — (RNS)—India will insist that foreign missionaries comply with the country's policy of limiting evangelical work to natives, two government officials told the Upper House of Parliament.

The officials are Home Minister Kallish Nath Katju and Deputy Home Minister B. N. Datar. Mr. Katju said that "if missionaries come here for evangelical work, the sooner they stop it, the better."

He said everyone in India was free to propagate his religion, but the government did not want people from other countries to come to India to do such work.

Earlier, Mr. Datar told the House that there are 65 Roman Catholic and 50 Protestant missionary societies working in India.

He said the societies should carry on educational, medical, philanthropic, rural, and social "uplift" work and not take part in politics.

The two officials indicated that all missionaries seeking entry into India knew the limitations imposed upon them and agreed to them.

**Historical Flag Presented As Congressmen's Gift**

As a result of an interchange of correspondence between Aide-de-Camp Vernon A. Hart and Congressman Kenneth E. Keating of the House of Representatives, Holy Rosary Commandery 106 of the Knights of St. John now possesses an historical American flag.

A personal gift to the local Commandery from Congressman Keating, the flag was accompanied by a letter from a government official verifying the fact that this same flag had flown from the dome of the United States Capitol in Washington, D. C.

In a personal message from the legislator, Keating expressed his admiration for the Knights of St. John and its principles and the Catholic Church in particular for the staunch fight that is being waged constantly against the evils of Communism.

IN SPECIAL ceremony at the Knights and Ladies of St. John Club held Tuesday, April 22, the flag was blessed by the Rev. Paul G. Wehrab, assistant pastor of Holy Rosary Church and Chaplain of Commandery 106.
