

May Ceremonies Listed By Benedictine Monks

The Benedictine Monks at Mount Saviour Monastery, Madigan Road off Hedy Hollow Road, in Big Flats, near Elmira, are preparing this week for special ceremonies.


On Sunday, May 3, the feast of the Finding of the Holy Cross, the relic of the True Cross which the monastery possesses was exposed for veneration after Vespers at four o'clock. The Veneration concluded with Benediction with the relic, a service resembling Benediction of the Blessed Sacrament. Special devotion to the Cross, particularly during Easter tide, is an ancient devotion in the Catholic Church and the Benedictine Order.

THE MONKS of Mount Saviour are also planning special devo-

tions for all the Sundays and weekdays of May, the month dedicated to the Blessed Virgin, Mary. On Sundays, Vespers at four o'clock will be followed by the chanting of the Litany of the Blessed Virgin and Benediction of the Blessed Sacrament.

After the evening service of Compline, at 6:40 on Sundays and 7:40 on weekdays, the monks will solemnize the hymn to the Blessed Virgin which they sing in the chapel before retiring. In place of the usual simple chant which they sing for this hymn, they will use the more solemn chant ordinarily reserved for the great feasts of the year. The public is welcome to attend all the services. The chapel in the monastery is still being used, but visitors may inspect the new Chapel of Our Lady Queen of Peace on which construction is progressing.

Cleveland Sets Golden Jubilee For Abp. Hoban

Cleveland—(RNS)—This city's Public Hall resembled a huge Cathedral as His Excellency Archbishop Edward F. Hoban offered a Solemn Pontifical Mass in celebration of his 50 years in the priesthood.

Worshippers at the Mass, first of a series of events honoring the prelate, saw the stage converted into a sanctuary with a large gold cross above the altar in the background.

A choir of 7,000 elementary school children sang. Also assisting at the Mass were 700 representative high school pupils and 2,000 nuns and teaching brothers.

BY HIS SERMON, Most. Clarence E. Elwell, diocesan superintendent of schools, praised the archbishop for the growth of the diocese since he came here as its spiritual leader 10 years ago.

These included the building of 50 schools housing 15,000 pupils and the enlarging and reconditioning of 23 others.

In the same period, said Elwell, the archbishop had supervised the construction of 40 churches and 40 convents.

THE OBSERVANCE will continue with a holy hour in Cleveland Stadium on June 28 and a Jubilee Mass in St. John's Cathedral on July 6.

Archbishop Hoban was ordained July 11, 1903. Before coming to Cleveland, he was Auxiliary Bishop of Chicago and head of the diocese of Rockford, Ill.

Reds Force Oath On Polish Clergy

London—(NC)—Priests throughout Poland are being compelled to take an oath of loyalty to the communist regime. It was revealed in a Warsaw Radio broadcast heard here.

The oath is required by a government decree issued early in February. It stipulates that priests must pledge loyalty to the "people's republic" before the director of the Bureau of Religious Affairs or the chairman of the local communist council.

The Warsaw broadcast asserted that hundreds of priests had already taken the oath at Stalin-grod (formerly Katowice), Warsaw and other places.

Franciscans Aid Victims Of Wreck

London—(NC)—A Franciscan priest joined rescuers in a jammed tunnel under east London to help injured and dying in the worst disaster on the city's underground railway system.

Three Franciscans in the local parish of Stratford went to the scene immediately when they heard of the disaster during the evening rush hour. Two of them spent the night either at the subway entrance or at the nearby hospital attending to the injured.

The third, Father Romuald Eddy, O.F.M., spent over two hours amid the wrecked coaches of two trains—one of which had run into the back of the other—in a single-line tunnel stacked high with debris. At least one of the 12 dead to whom Father Romuald gave conditional absolution was a Catholic.
