China Reds Monopolize Nun's Medical Service

Hong Kong-(NC)-A Cathelic nun-a narme symouymous with a "murderer of orphans' in Chinese Communist propaganda - found her medical services so more opplized by the Reds that the ordinary citizens complained about it. The story was told here by Sister Fortunata Kohler. a Swiss Dominican, after her ouster by the Chinese officials.

Interned for more than a year by the Reds at Tingchow, West Kuklen province, the nun was nevertheless permitted to continue operating a makeshift dispensary. The people availvisit the houses of two poor noonie is men ier the stake ing themselves most of the
