## Senior Orators Of 2 Schools Get Medals

Two Rochester high school seniors, Roberta Guzzetta of the Academy of the Sacred Heart and Lawrence J. Oberlies of Aquinas Institute, won the finals of the Bishop's Regional Elocution Contest in Aquinas auditorium on May 6.

They were presented with gold medals by Bishop Kearney, who termed the speeches of the finalists "outstanding" and "immaculate." Miss Guzzetta and Oberlies also won plaques for their schools. The trophies be-

come the permanent possessions of the schools if they are won three times.

Oberlies, son of Mr. and Mrs. Hubert H. Oberlies, 144 Salinas St., won the boy's medal for a talk entitled, "Our Forgotten Heritage," in which he described the rights and privileges granted under the Constitution, and the work of its authors. Later, he extemporaneously urged his listeners to review the Constitution and make it a part of their daily lives.

Miss Guzzetta, daughter of Dr. and Mrs. Anthony J. Guzzetta, 225 Georgian Court Rd., gave "A Plea to American Women." She warned American women should not overemphasize the victory won in their battle for equal rights at the sacrifice of their dignity they gain only through their homes.

THE SIX FINALISTS competing in the contest all were selected after eliminations held at their respective schools.

Other finalists and their topics were: George Bauer of St. Andrew's Seminary, "Bishop McQuaid, Patron of Catholic Education"; Anne Shirley Cieslinski of Nazareth Academy, "A Return to Old Frontiers"; Theresa Finks of St. Agnes High School, "Before Tragedy Strikes"; and Rita Prado of Our Lady of Mercy High School, "Posterity's Richest Legacy."

Judges for the contest were the Very Rev. Alexander Beaton, guardian, and the Rev. Terence Cummings, both of the Franciscan Friars of the Atonement, Montour Falls, and the Rev. Lorenzo Reed, supervisor of Jesuit High Schools for the New York District.

## 2 Nazareth Faculty Members To Visit LePuy

Sister Margaret Teresa, professor of Literature at Nazareth College and Book Reviewer for the Courier-Journal and Sister M. Dominic, Director of the College Library, will travel to France this summer to visit LePuy, the mother foundation of the Sisters of St. Joseph.

A singular honor was bestowed recently on the vast community of the Sisters of St. Joseph throughout the world when the French government conferred the Cross of the Legion of Honor on Mother Marie-Fulbert Chappon, the Superior General of the LePuy community, Haute-Loire, France.

The Rochester community of the Sisters of St. Joseph, with Nazareth Motherhouse in Pittsford, is a direct descendant of the LePuy foundation, begun in 1650.

LePUY HALL, the beautiful senior dormitory at Nazareth College, Pittsford is named in honor of the mother community.

Mother Rose Miriam, Superior General and Sister Martina Marie visited the LePuy Motherhouse in France in 1950, during the tercentenary celebration of the Sisters of St. Joseph.

The decoration awarded Mother Marie-Fulbert Chappon was in recognition of the important social and educational work of her congregation of 500 sisters.

The honor was also in acknowledgment of the extension through out the world of 30,000 sisters of other St. Joseph congregations which have sprung from the LePuy community.

Nazareth Community in the Rochester diocese is one of the largest daughter foundations in the world.
