The ceremonies opened at 7:30 p.m. in the lobby of the Dunn Memorial. The student nurses, with graduate nurses at the hospital, nuns and friends, formed a procession. The procession moved from in front of the Dunn Memorial on Dewitt Ave., south to E. Market St., east on Market to High St. and north on High to the rear of the Dunn Memorial.

During the procession, the Rosary was recited. The Rev. Philip McGhan, hospital chaplain, led the prayers.
