3 Branch Centers Added To Reading Laboratory

The Sisters of Mercy have expanded their Reading Laboratory program now daily functioning at Our Lady of Mercy High School to include three branch centers during the summer, one each in Auburn, Elmira and Holy Cross, Rochester. St. Patrick's school, Elmira and Holy Family School, Auburn have been selected as centrally located centers.

Summer sessions for remedial reading classes in each center extends from July 8 to 31. School authorities announce registration for Our Lady of Mercy Reading Laboratory for Sunday, May 24 from 9:00 a.m. to 9:00 p.m. at the school on Blossom Road.

Registration of the branch schools will be in early June. Full particulars, including time and place of registration will be announced later. Registrations for summer sessions are accepted by personal interview with parents only. "Since a testing program must be arranged even those who have already telephoned concerning registration must call in person."

Sister Mary de Pazzi, head of the reading laboratory said. Sister also said that the same techniques and material will be used in each center. The faculty composed of Sisters of Mercy, has been especially trained at Our Lady of Mercy Laboratory.
