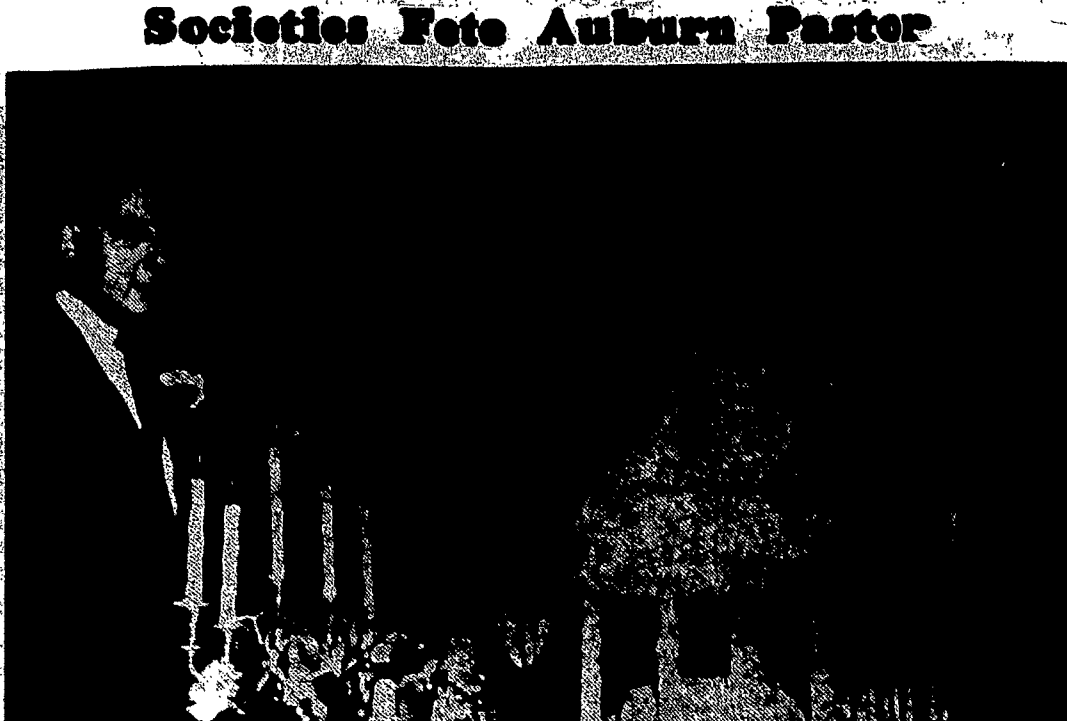
**Two Geneva Couples Wedded**
