

# First Nazareth College Graduating Class To Mark Silver Jubilee of Commencement

At least 12 of the 15 members of Nazareth College's first graduating class will celebrate the 25th anniversary of their commencement next weekend.

Scheduled as a class dinner at Guy Michael's restaurant, May 29, is a family picnic at Powder Mill Park, May 30; attendance in a body at the college's 25th annual Baccalaureate exercises, luncheon and guests at the college with His Excellency, Bishop Kearney, and a tea for the reception of this year's graduates into the Alumnae Association, May 31.

Also, Mrs. Frank Lawler (Constance Hogan), Geneva; Mrs. Arthur Meisch (Rosetta Meisch), Rushville; Mrs. Gerald Morsches (Evelyn Pritchard), Fort Wayne, Ind.; Mrs. John Desel (Cynthia Stabel), Wolcott; and Miss Rosemary Edelman, New York City.

The other members of the class of '28 — Mrs. Oscar Rosenbauer (Mary Connelly), Brighton, Mass.; Mrs. Milton Orr (Margaret McPhee), Toledo, O.; and Mrs. Bonnell Carlton (Mary Swann), Portland, Ore. — are not expected.

WHILE A MAJORITY of the class are housewives, some are active in other fields as well. Mrs. McGraw is assistant librarian at Nazareth College. Mrs. Costich, with her husband, is proprietor of Toy Town. Miss Edelman is an attorney in New York City.

Mrs. Desel operates a farm and acts as secretary at her husband's plant, the Otto Engineering Co. Miss McGraw is supervisor of home finding in the Child Placement Division, Monroe County Welfare Dept. Mrs. Marx teaches high school, and Mrs. Lawler is a social case worker for the Ontario County Welfare Dept.

Of the families represented by the class, there are 44 children. Of these, two have been graduated from Nazareth College: Miss Constance Costich, who went on to earn a Master of Science degree at Fordham University; and Mrs. Rose Parsons (the former Frances Ennis), of the Pittsford Central School facility. Miss Rita Ennis will receive her degree from the college June 3, and Miss Nancy Costich is a member of the junior class.

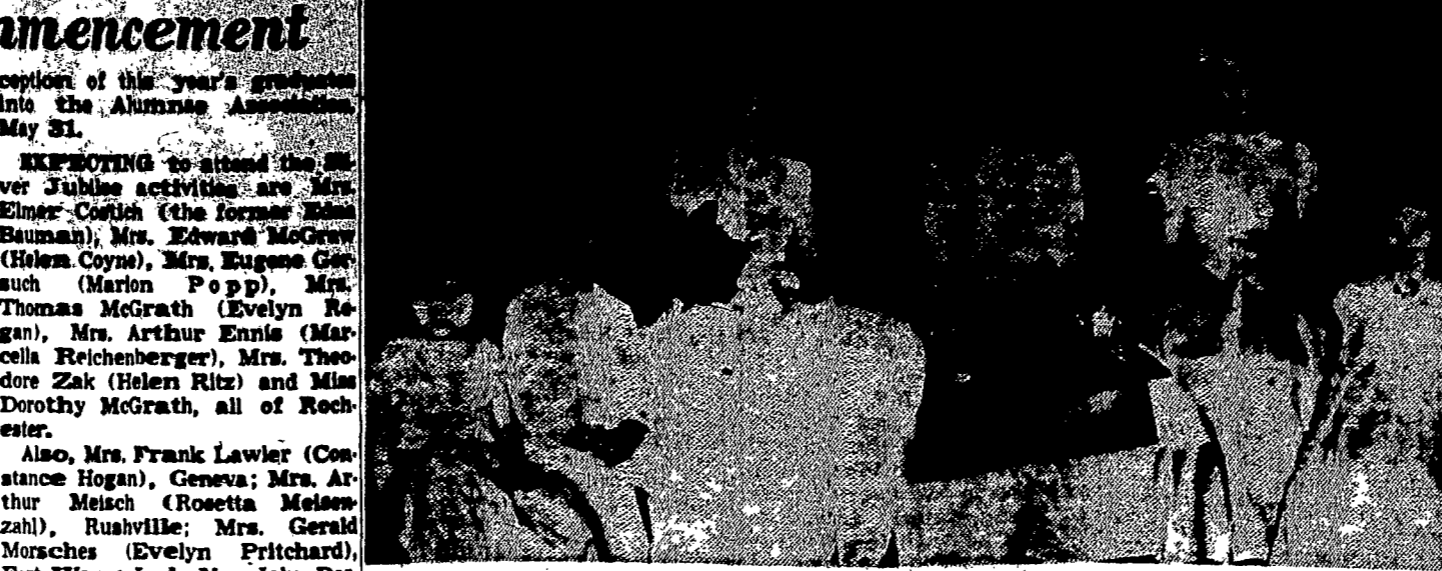
MEMBERS of the original Nazareth College faculty have been invited to join in the jubilee. These include the Rt. Rev. Magr. Louis W. Edelman, St. Louis parish, Pittsford; the Rt. Rev. Magr. William Byrne, Ithaca; the Rev. John Napier, Shortsville; Al Sigel, Times Union staff member; and four Sisters of St. Joseph who still serve on the college faculty.

The present class, consisting of 24 freshmen, met for the first time in September, 1929, at the college's original location in the "Glass House" on Lake Ave., adjoining Nazareth Academy. The building was so named because of the many mirrors and glass doors which the previous owner had installed.

Dean of the college was Sister Teresa Marie, who continued in that position until her retirement in 1943. An anniversary Requiem Mass, attended by the present college faculty and student body, will be celebrated for her June 2, at 11 o'clock. She died May 23, 1952.

The first class was graduated before the college was moved to its second location — on Augustine St., in the former Motherhouse of the Sisters of St. Joseph. The present campus, on East Ave., was occupied in January, 1942.
