Music Festival At Eastman Acclaimed By Critics
 The fruits of hard labor and top-notch talent were displayed Tuesday and Wednesday evenings at the Eastman Theatre in the fifth annual Catholic Schools Music Festival.

Reviews of the local music critics and the praise of the layman were heaped on the teachers and participants in the rewarding two-night program.

On Tuesday evening, the Inter-Parochial School Orchestra, under the direction of Wilfred R. Duquette, rendered four offerings showing studied training and coordination.

THE NAZARETH College Glee Club received highest praise for their interpretation of Philip Kreckel's "Ave Maria." Raymond J. Hasenauer directed the Aquinas Institute Glee Club in a program that ranged from the beautiful liturgical hymn "Ecce Panis Angelorum" to the rousing "Stouthearted Men."

St. Mary's Hospital School of Nursing Glee Club, directed by Francis J. Pilecki, gave as one of their selections, LeRoy Anderson's clever arrangement of "The Syncope Clock."

J. Theodore Hollenbach conducted the St. Agnes High School Glee Club in a choice group of classic choral studies.

BOTH TUESDAY and Wednesday evenings, the audience heard the Boys and Girls Chorus. All Girl Chorus and Boys Glee Club, each group made up entirely of elementary school pupils.

They were directed by Austin Truit, Virginia Bogdan and Mr. Hollenbach respectively and each displayed amazingly versatile talent with selections that ranged from Gregorian chant to the "Rumanian Rhapsody."

Dance arrangements that included a delightful feature for 24 tiny tots, highlighted both evenings of choral and orchestral music. A colorfully costumed Florida Sextet, modern dances to the Aquinas Swing Orchestra and a highly attractive "Rosenkavalier Waltz" displayed excellence in rhythm and showmanship.

ON WEDNESDAY evening, Our Lady of Mercy High School Glee Club, directed by Monica Servas Miller, offered an exquisite rendition of Roger's "The Virgin's Slumber Song," with the lovely voice of Sheila Flynn as soloist.

The smartly costumed Nazareth Academy Fontbonne Band, with Kenneth B. Waide conducting, appeared at the Festival for the first time, playing with lively enthusiasm.

Nazareth Academy's Persian Choir sang with deft quality and sureness of tone, under the direction of Austin Truit.

Excellent training and especially fine talent displayed by the Academy of the Sacred Heart Choir led by Kathleen Zimmer.

ANOTHER FIRST appearance was afforded by the St. John Fisher Glee Club, conducted by a fellow-student, Francis J. Pilecki. Their well chosen selections were rendered with telling resonance and fine timbre.

Special praise must go to the Aquinas Institute Band and their director, Mr. Hasenauer, who played selections during the intervals varied and pleasing arrangements that kept the program moving.

In all, over 1500 students participated in the two-evening Festival, which was sponsored by His Excellency Bishop Kearney and under the direction of the Rt. Rev. Mgr. Charles J. Mahoney, Diocesan Superintendent of Schools.
