

# Bishops Kearney, Casey To Open 3 New Centers Of Nocturnal Adoration

Plans for the establishment of a new Center of Nocturnal Adoration at Sacred Heart Cathedral were completed last Friday evening when His Excellency, Auxiliary Bishop Lawrence B. Casey, Rector of the Cathedral, met with Pastors and about 70 laymen from the eleven parishes in the northwest section of Rochester and the town of Greece.

The Center will open on Saturday night, June 13 with a single Nocturnal Hour commencing at 10 p.m. at which all present members from these eleven parishes will make their regular monthly Hour of Adoration, together with new members who have joined the Society during the city-wide membership invitation which is now going on.

All Catholic men in these eleven parishes are asked to attend this opening Hour of Adoration, when they may join as Charter Members of this new Center.

**THE HOUR** will consist of Exposition of the Blessed Sacrament, recitation of a portion of the Office of the Blessed Sacrament, reception of new members, greetings and sermon by His Excellency, Bishop Casey, closing with Benediction.

The Parishes to be included in this new Branch of the Society include, besides the Cathedral, Holy Apostles, Holy Cross, Holy Rosary, Our Mother of Sorrows, Most Precious Blood, St. Anthony, St. Charles, St. Patrick, St. John, Greece and St. Theodore.

It is expected that a large group of men will participate in this opening Nocturnal vigil, making it one of the outstanding Eucharistic events in the history of Rochester.

Other Nocturnal Adoration Centers are to be established at St. Andrew Church on Saturday night, June 8 for men residing in the 25 Parishes in the northwest section of Rochester and Webster; and at St. Monica Church on Saturday night, June 20, for men living in the 11 Parishes in the southwest area.

**HIS EXCELLENCY** Bishop Kearney will officiate at both of these openings and will induct the new Charter Members, now being invited to join.

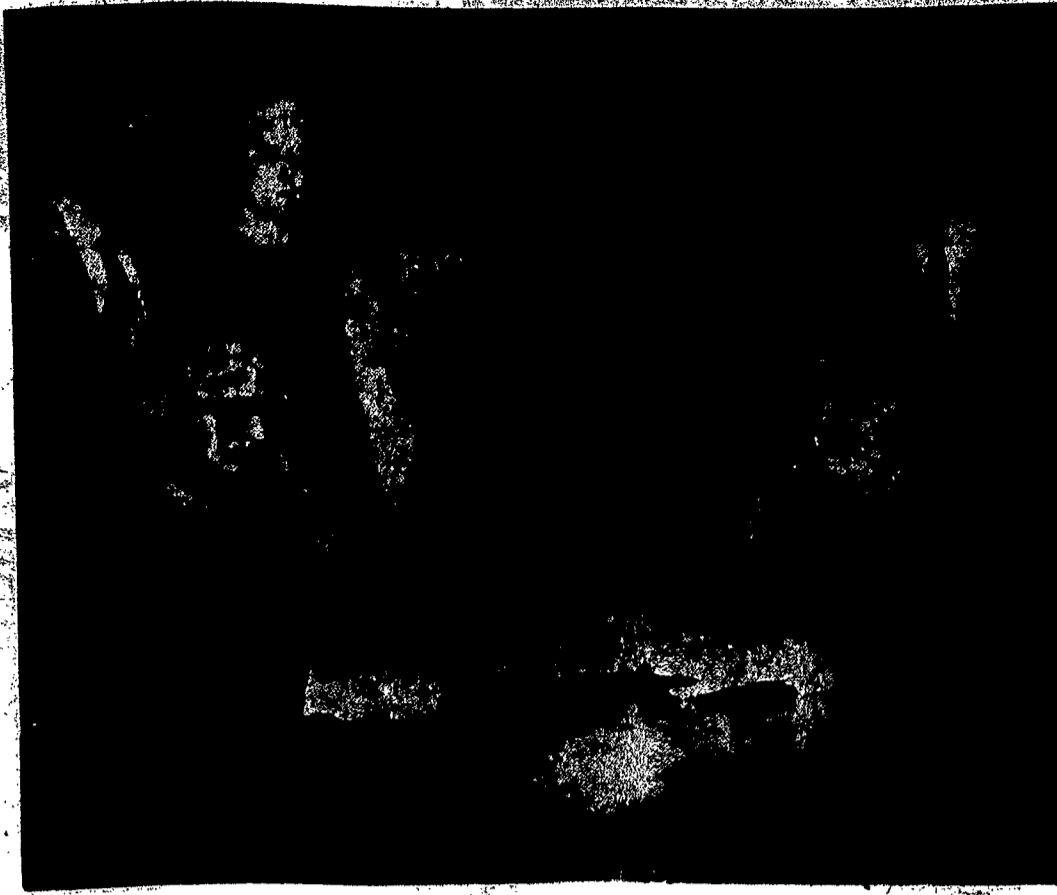
Men in Parishes of the Southeast section are now making their monthly Nocturnal Hours at Blessed Sacrament Church since the formation of that Center on March 29, 1952.

The original Center of Nocturnal Adoration in Rochester which has for many years been held at St. Patrick's Church and prior to that in Lady Chapel of old St. Patrick's Cathedral, will close following the all-night vigils on Saturday night, May 30.

**AT ALL OF** the new Centers, opening in June, one single hour will be observed for both old members being transferred from the St. Patrick's Center and new members.

All members in the various Centers will immediately thereafter be divided into eight bands and assigned one hour commencing at 10:00 p.m. on the last Saturday night of the month.

# Dansville Parishes Form Group To Plan New School

Dansville—Eighty parents of Dansville's two parochial schools, St. Mary's and St. Patrick's, gathered to discuss ways and means to further operation of the two schools which will be merged into one beginning this fall, and closed the meeting with high hopes for "the kind of building" the children deserve within five years.

The group met in the Knights of Columbus rooms, Thursday of last week and again on Thursday, this week.

Organized was the Catholic Education Association, an outgrowth of a committee of 16 which got together last November to effect the merger. The committee was composed of eight members of each parish with Howard Cole as chairman.

**OFFICERS** elected were: J. Joseph Mahoney, president; Mrs. Harold A. Shay and Mrs. James Holden, vice presidents; Mrs. Paul E. Wamp, Jr., secretary and Robert F. Hart, treasurer.

The group discussed possible costs for a new building and it was estimated that it might be constructed for as little as \$140,000 or even \$80,000 as one speaker put it.

It is understood that stress would be put on a "functional" building rather than one of elaborate design and construction.

The use of cement blocks for an exterior, cement serious study," the Rev. John D. O'Donnell, declared, citing the instances of other parochial schools using that type of construction with what he termed "great success."

**THE NEW SOCIETY** was addressed by the Rt. Rev. Msgr. Charles J. Mahoney, superintendent, Catholic Schools, Diocese of Rochester; the Rev. Edward M. Scheld, pastor of St. Mary's Church and Father O'Donnell, pastor of St. Patrick's Church. Movement for immediate action on a building campaign was urged.
