1200 Attend Mass Marking Mercy High's 25 Years

HIS EXCELLENCY Bishop Kearney conferred degrees and academic honors on the young women who Sunday morning heard the Rev. Edward A. Molloy, C.S.B.R., tell them that their "faculty has striven four long years to help prepare you for your final diploma, your degree of sainthood."

"That the learned woman be holy and the holy woman learned—that's why Nazareth College exists," Father Murphy said. "Now as you leave, remember that you must stand for something or you will fall for anything."

The "presumptuous and optimistic, the rosy dreams of the Victorians and the myth of inevitable progress as well as the current despair and pessimism are both sins against hope," he explained. "Neither takes into account the loving presence of Divine Providence."

"Not by brains alone does man live," Father Murphy reminded the graduates, warning them that "if this new atom age is not to be a tragic twisted thing, you must do much to reassure the world. The task would be hopeless if it depended on you; but as a channel of Divine grace, you can change a world."

THE PURPOSE of Catholic education, Father Molloy explained, is to make saints. "For this primary purpose," he said, "the Catholic Church exists and everything else which it touches to do, its supreme objective. If its schools and other institutions failed to produce saints, the Church would have 'totally missed the point of its existence, and our very institutions would be millstones around our necks'."

Father Molloy, an army chaplain for four years, three of which were spent in the Pacific area, is a retreat master at the Notre Dame Retreat House on Alexander Street, Bishop Kearney.
