

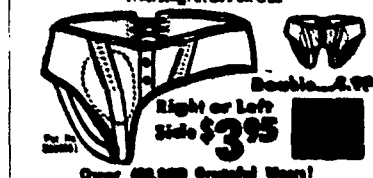

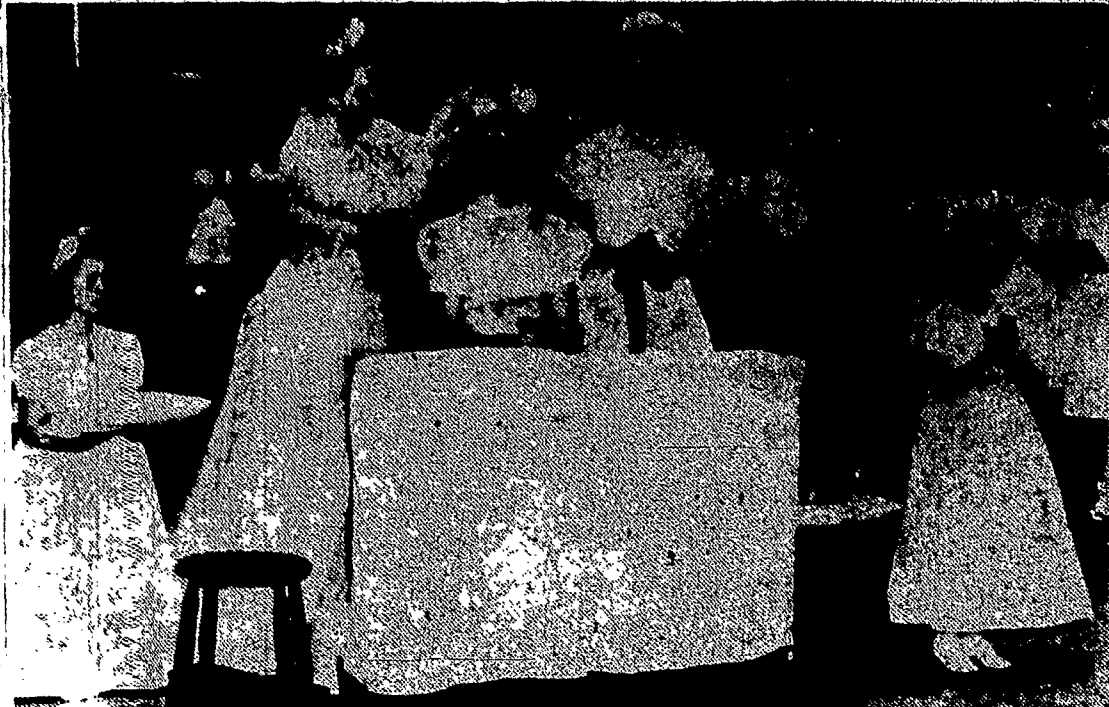

Symbolic Colors Feature May Crowning At St. Ann's

Hornell — Ceremonies symbolizing the selection of the Blessed Virgin Mary as "Queen of the May" were held in St. Ann's Church, Friday evening.

The Rev. John L. Coonan, assistant pastor, explained the significance of the May crowning to the several hundred parishioners present. "Make Mary the queen of your own heart," he said. "Selection of the Mother of God as your model will increase your faith and your virtue."

ABOUT 75 STUDENTS of St. Ann's School participated in the exercises, which marked the closing of May devotions. Girls from the sixth, seventh, eighth and ninth grades formed a living "Rosary" in the sanctuary of the church.

By their apparel, the girls represented the World Mission Rosary. They wore head scarves of yellow, red, green, blue or white. They were styled like those worn by the peasant children at Fatima.

Father Coonan explained that yellow signifies the Orient, and asked parishioners to "pray that God may give our Oriental brothers the gift of faith."

"Red represents the countries of Europe," he said. "Offer your prayers in this decade for protection of those peoples from the dangers of Communism."
