GOD LOVE YOU!

WE have been associated with the Missions long enough to draw a few conclusions. For instance: the relatively poor are the best friends of the Missions. We have known only one rich person who gave to the Holy Father's Missions in proportion to the capital possessed. This does not mean the rich are not generous. Perhaps they give at home where they will see the effects of their giving; perhaps they like colorful expenditures. We cannot judge their motives; we only pray they may discover the truth of the words of the Holy Father: "Charity to the Society for the Propagation of the Faith surpasses all other charities as heaven earth and eternity time."

But why are the relatively poor lovers of the missions? For example: GOD LOVE YOU to D. L. "This \$5 represents tips received checking hats for one evening." GOD LOVE YOU to J. M. "This \$200 is a deposit made for a trip to Europe this summer. Now that I am not going, I would like to send it to the Missions." GOD LOVE YOU to G. K. "This \$12 represents money I earned crocheting little baby shoes." GOD LOVE YOU to M. C. "Mary, age 11, sold her pet Persian kitten for \$10 which she sends to the Missions." GOD LOVE YOU to M. S. "Enclosed is \$35 saved through sacrifice from cigarettes, beer and shows, for not having any sickness for four months and in thanksgiving for a chance to repent." GOD LOVE YOU to Mr. and Mrs. A. S. "Enclosed is \$25 for the Missions. We are sacrificing a special treat to be able to do this." GOD LOVE YOU to D. L. R. "Enclosed is \$30 which I have been saving little by little for some time. Hope it will help the Mission." GOD LOVE YOU to F. R. R. "I put all the dimes I would get in change in a small bank and upon opening it I found \$7.60 which I am sending the Missions."

Why are these people who are not blessed with abundance, self-sacrificing to spread the faith? Probably for two reasons: 1. The Mission world is poor. Two-thirds of the world go to bed hungry. They have a natural affinity of the poor for the poor of those who have little for those who have nothing. But the greater the contrast one enjoys, the harder it is to feel the need of others. Those who sacrifice a dessert to help starving Indians are already one with them in their need. 2. Those with little worldly goods possess humility more generally than those who are proud of their possessions.

Those who give generously often like their names on libraries and windows and schools. Our little "army of sacrificers" are not concerned about these names for they know the Holy Father distributes it to starving Indians, destitute Africans and orphans in Ceylon. The poor know Christ said: "I was hungry and you gave me to eat; I was thirsty and you gave Me to drink." They know that they who are helping the least of His brethren are helping Christ. Real Christian benevolence rests on the identification of Christ with the suffering.

We have a thousand other good reasons. Suffice it to say: the poor in the missions cannot reward you for your sacrifice, therefore God must do it. What a blessing!
