Moravia Women's Group Hears Television Talk

Moravia — Mrs. Frank T. Curtin of Rochester's Diocesan Council of Catholic Women spoke at the annual banquet of St. Patrick's Rosary Altar Society held at the Goodrich House on Tuesday evening, May 26.
Mrs. Curtin chose as her topic, "Television — Molding a New Medium". She remarked that television was rapidly supplanting all other media of communication.
AS STATISTICS, Mrs. Curtin stated: "Today its 120 broadcasting stations reach some 5,000,000 sets with an audience of some 19,000,000. In another five years it is estimated that some 1,500 stations will reach 50,000,000 sets and 150,000,000 people. These same 120 TV stations enjoy an income exceeding that of 2900 radio stations."
The speaker referred to TV as "a powerful instrument with an awesome potential for good or evil."

Bad Books Bill Strengthened

Concord, N.H. — (NC) — The New Hampshire House of Representatives has approved overwhelmingly a bill which will facilitate the winning of court convictions against dealers who sell obscene literature.
The bill, passed despite an adverse committee recommendation, provides a specific definition of the word "obscene" and makes a surprise victory for New Hampshire legislator Louis J. Martel of Manchester who has tried in several past sessions to get definite action against distribution of printed filth.
Catholic women in the Manchester diocese have recently waged a vigorous crusade to rid the State of such publications.
Various legislators reported that they became "fighting mad" after seeing some of the sample publications and pictures which Rep. Martel said were available at many New Hampshire newsstands.

Consecration Music Records Made By St. Bernard's Choir

The recording, made at the recording studio of Sacred Heart Cathedral on June 3, playing time of the record is 47 minutes.
MOST OF THE music sung at the consecration ceremonies has been recorded, including: The Trumpet Fanfare, Ecce Sacerdos by Perosi, Introit - St. Dilligis (Gregorian), Missa Chorals by Refice, Ave Verum by Mozart, Sacra Solemnitas by Caselloni, Te Deum by Flor Peeters and Handel's Halleluia Chorus.
The record, a 12 inch long playing (33 1/3) vinylite, will sell for \$3.25 plus \$.50 for packing charges and postage.
