

Diocesan HN Men To Combat Lewd Literature

Adoption of a resolution to combat evil literature as a contributing factor to juvenile delinquency highlighted the annual meeting of Rochester Diocesan Holy Name Union held Sunday, June 14 in Our Lady of Lourdes School Hall, Brighton.

John M. Hedges of St. Ambrose Parish, Rochester was elected president to succeed Martin Q. Moll of Our Lady of Lourdes Parish who presided at Sunday's sessions.

The Holy Name men from various sections of the diocese heard the Very Rev. James McGinley, O.C.S.O., superior of Our Lady of the Genesee Monastery near Piffard speak on "The Spiritual Needs of the Hour."

Father Gerard explained that love of God and submission to the divine will are necessary for the sanctification of men's souls.

He also explained the role of his Trappist order in the spiritual life of the church.

THE DELEGATES were warned by the Rev. Patrick J. Flynn, diocesan spiritual director to keep in mind that the Holy Name Society is a spiritual organization.

"The Holy Name Society," he said, "is not a social or recreational club. Its members are dedicated to the love and service of the Divine Christ."

"When a parish Holy Name Society bogs down or fails, there is only one reason—it has ceased to be a spiritual organization; Christ and His love have been forgotten."

"The important thing for Holy Name Men," Father Flynn said, "is devotion to the Holy Mass

and the reception of Holy Communion. Our contribution, as Holy Name men, is to help other men know and love the Divine Christ of the Tabernacle. He is the same Christ that once walked in Galilee, that died on a cross."
