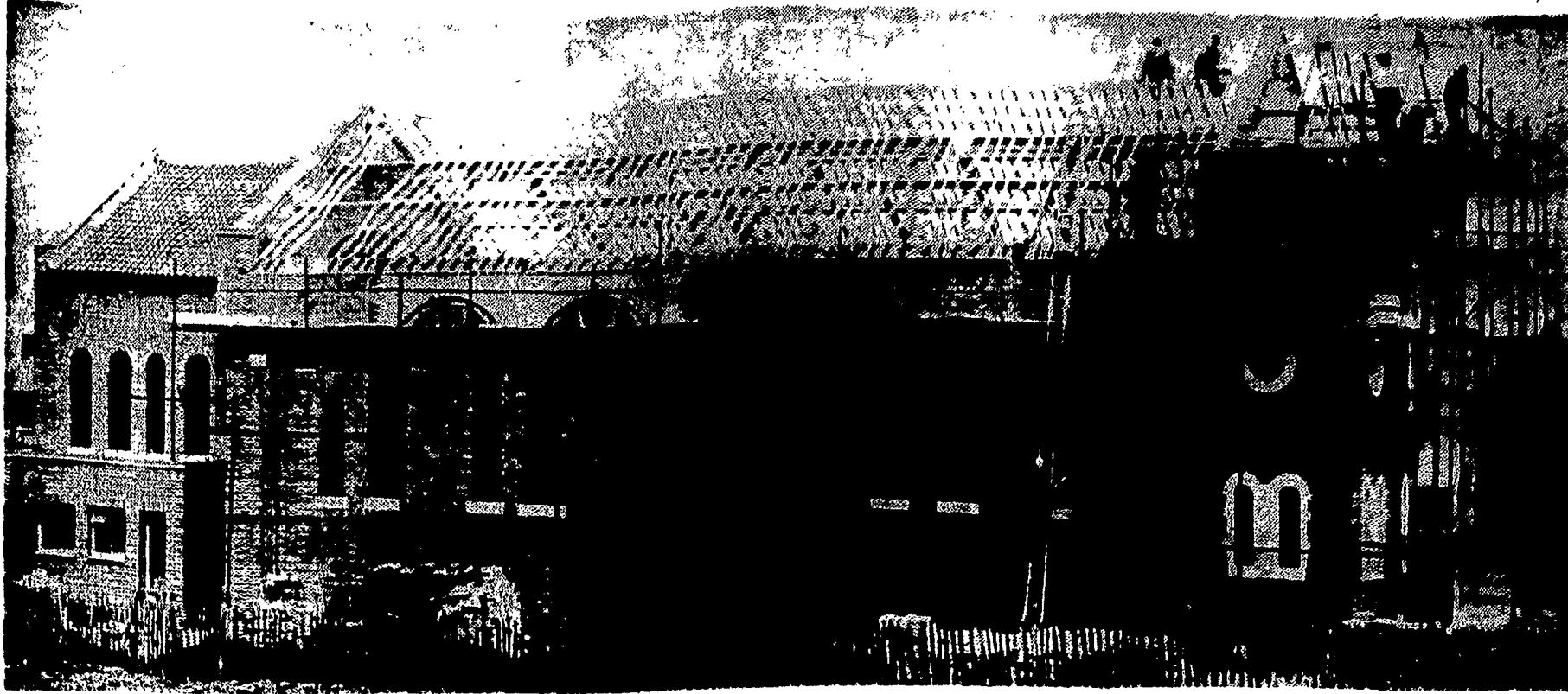


St. John Fisher Feast Finds His Church About Finished

700 Men At St. Monica's Form Southwest Nocturnal Center

The idea that recent greatly increased devotion to the Immaculate Heart of Mary might be expected to draw men to the higher devotion that directed to the Sacred Heart of Jesus in the Blessed Sacrament was voiced by His Excellency, Bishop James E. Kearney in speaking Saturday night, June 20th, at the erection of the new Southwest Center of the Nocturnal Adoration Society at St. Monica's Church, Genesee St.

Nearly 700 men from the eleven parishes in the sectors west of the River and south of Lyell Avenue were present for the establishment of this fourth unit of the Society in Rochester. The Very Rev. Msgr. Gerald C. Lambert, Pastor of St. Monica's and Spiritual Director of the new Center, extended welcome to the old and new members of the Society and said:

"I CANNOT let this opportunity pass to tell you how impressed I have been by this remarkable demonstration of devotion to Our Lord in the Blessed Sacrament which we have seen here tonight. Indeed I can tell you how the activity of the Officers and Committees of this Society during the past month has impressed the clergy. What has been accomplished in the formation of these three new Centers hardly seemed possible when it

St. John Fisher Feast Observed In Diocese

Throughout the Diocese of Rochester, here, by special request of His Excellency Bishop Kearney, all Masses celebrated Monday, except Funeral Masses were in honor of St. John Fisher, martyred Cardinal-Bishop of Rochester, England. At the same time the church rising in Rochester, England as a gift of Catholics here is almost completed as the Feast occurs.

St. John Fisher was put to death at London Tower, 416 years ago Monday, June 22, 1535, because he refused to take an oath recognizing King Henry VIII as head of the Church of England.

The special privilege of celebrating the Mass and reciting the Office of St. John Fisher was granted in this Diocese of Rochester in New York State, by the Holy See at Bishop Kearney's request in 1941.

THE LINK between the new world Diocese of Rochester and the old in Kent, England is forged by not only this observance of the Feast, but by the operation of a college for men named for the sainted Martyr-Bishop and by the erection of the new church edifice in the town in which Bishop John Fisher had his See.

Report on the progress of the church in England is made by the Rev. Thomas F. O'Riordan, Parish Priest of Chatham and Rochester, Kent, under whose personal direction the church is being constructed.

It was Father O'Riordan who last year, accepted a check for \$30,000 a gift from the Catholics of New York State's Diocese of Rochester to build the church in "Old Rochester."

The fund was raised on appeal of Bishop Kearney and sent by His Excellency to England by the Very Rev. Msgr. Donald M. Cleary and the Rev. Richard T. Torney. A third of the amount
