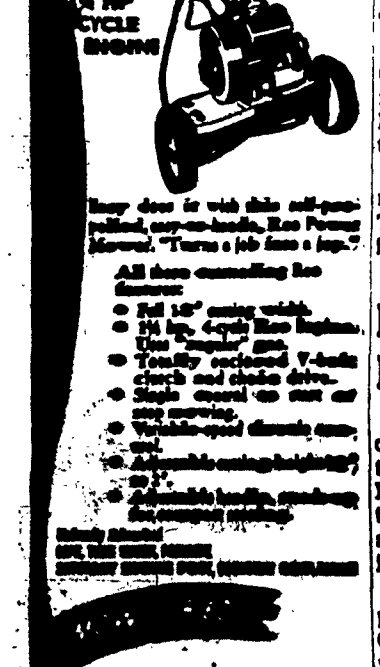


Rochester Represented At Red Cross Meeting

First Solemn Mass Slated For Basilian

The Rev. Leon G. Hart, C.S.B., son of Mr. and Mrs. Leon G. Hart, 36 Eglantine Road, Rochester, will celebrate his first Solemn Mass in St. Charles Borromeo Church, Sunday July 5 at 10 a.m.

The young man will be ordained to the Holy Priesthood by His Eminence James C. Cardinal McGuigan, in St. Basil's Church, Toronto, on Monday, June 23.

Assisting in the First Solemn Mass will be the Rev. Robert A. Keleher, assistant priest; the Rev. W. Oscar Regan, C.S.B., deacon and the Rev. Marvin LeFrois, subdeacon.

SERMON WILL be preached by the Rev. Gerard French, C.S.B., a former teacher at Aquinas Institute and now stationed at Catholic Central High School, Detroit.

Before entering the Basilian Fathers Novitiate in 1943, Father Hart attended St. Charles Borromeo School and Aquinas Institute here. Later he received his college education at St. Michael's College, Toronto; his teacher's training at the University of Detroit and teaching experience in Basilian conducted school in Detroit, Houston, Rochester and Toronto.

A reception will be held in St. Charles Borromeo Parish Hall from 4 to 7 p.m. on July 5 followed immediately by Benediction of the Blessed Sacrament.

In September, Father Hart will return to St. Basil's Seminary, Toronto to continue his theological studies.

Funeral services for Sister M. Hortense Schenck of the Sisters of Saint Joseph, who died in St. Joseph's Hospital, Elmira, Saturday, June 20, 1958, were held at Nazareth Convent, Pittsford, Tuesday morning.

Rev. Francis J. Hoefen celebrated the Solemn Requiem Mass assisted by Rev. Hubert A. Bisky, Deacon, Rev. George M. Kalb, Sub-deacon, and Rev. William H. Shannon, Master of Ceremonies.
