**Army Padre', Radio Speaker On July Series**

Washington, D. C. (NC)—A World War I song title, "Keep the Home Fires Burning," is the appropriate title of a series of radio talks by Chaplain Francis L. Sampson, the "Paratrooper Padre." Father Sampson's "Faith in Our Time" series was announced by the National Council of Catholic Men along with two other NCCM-sponsored radio program schedules for July.

Father Sampson will deliver five talks on Thursday at 12:45 over the Mutual Broadcasting System. Father John V. Sheridan will be the speaker on "The Christian in Action" for the Saturdays of July at 11:35 on the American Broadcasting Company network. The Catholic Hour, on the National Broadcasting Company network at 2 p.m. on Sundays, will feature Msgr. Joseph Glenn.

"THE 'HOME FIRES', as Father Sampson will describe them in his talks, are the "The Fire of Faith" (July 2); "The Fire of Love" (July 9); "The Fire of Sacrifice" (July 16); "The Fire of Piety" (July 23); "The Fire of Perseverance" (July 30).

As a chaplain, Father Sampson has served in Europe with the 101st Airborne Infantry and in Korea with the 187 Airborne Infantry. He was once a prisoner of war in Germany for six months and has received the Distinguished Service Cross, Bronze Star, Purple Heart and Croix de Guerre among other decorations.

**Card. Spellman Calls 'Moon Is Blue' Film 'Occasion Of Sin'**

New York (NC)—The motion picture, "The Moon Is Blue," has been denounced by His Eminence Francis Cardinal Spellman, Archbishop of New York, as "an occasion of sin" which violates seriously "standards of morality and decency." The Cardinal reminded Catholics of their obligation to avoid seeing it.

A letter from the Cardinal expressing his views on the film was read today (June 28) at all Masses in churches of the archdiocese. The film was produced by Otto Preminger, who also produced the stage play, and was released by United Artists.

"Because this picture bears a serious potential influence for evil," the Cardinal's letter said, "especially endangering to enter youth, tempting them to entertain ideas conflicting with the moral law, inclining to juvenile delinquency, I am gravely concerned about its presentation."

THE CARDINAL said he also was concerned because of the circumstances surrounding the production and release of the movie.

"This picture," Cardinal Spellman said, "was avowedly produced in defiance of the system of self-regulation which the motion picture industry itself has maintained for more than two decades. The presentation of this picture is not only in defiance of industry Code regulations, but is also a challenge to prove, if possible, that these regulations established by the industry itself, may be defied with impunity."

THE CARDINAL also noted that in accordance with the Legion pledge, Catholics should "stay away indefinitely from theaters which show condemned pictures as a matter of policy."
