Card. Spellman Calls 'Moon Is Blue' Film 'Occasion Of Sin'

New York (NC) - The mo tion picture, "The Moora Is Blue," has been denounced by His Eminence Francis Cardanal Spellman. Archbishop of New York, as "an occasion of sin" which violates seriously "standards of morality and decency The Cardinal reminded Catholics of their obligation to avoid seeing it.

A letter from the Cardinal expressing his views on the film was read today (June 28) at all Masses in churches of the archdiocese. The film was produced by Otto Preminger, who also produced the stage play, and was released by United Artists.

"Because this picture bears serious potential influence for evil," the Cardinal's letter said. especially endangering our youth, tempting them to entertain ideas conflicting with the moral law, inciting to juvenile delinquency. I am gravely concerned about its presentation."

THE CARDINAL said he also was concerned because of the circumstances surrounding the production and release of the movie.

"This picture." Cardinal Spellman said "was avowedly produc ed in defiance of the system of self-regulation which the motion picture industry itself has maintained for more than two decades. The presentation of this picture is not only in deflance of Industry Code regulations, but is also a challenge to prove, if possible, that these regulations established by the industry itself,

may be defled with Impursity. THE CARIDENAL also noted that in accordance with the Legion pledge, Catholics should "stay away indefirately from theaters which show condemned nictures as a master of policy."
