The role of 13 knights and 23 members of the Ladies Auxiliary who died during the past year was read at the 36th Annual Field Mass of Rochester Regiment, Knights of St. John and Auxiliaries celebrated in Holy Sepulchre cemetery Sunday.

### Turkish Stamp To Honor Feast Of Assumption

Ephesus, Turkey—(NC)—Preparations have been made by Turkish authorities to place on sale on Aug. 15 a special series of postal stamps commemorating the Assumption of the Blessed Virgin.

This ancient city of ruins is regarded by many as the site from which the incorrupt body of Mary, the mother of Jesus, was taken into Heaven to be reunited with her soul.

Another tradition holds that the Blessed Virgin actually died in Jerusalem and was assumed into Heaven from that City. The doctrine of the Assumption itself dates back to early Christian times and was proclaimed a dogma of the Catholic Faith by His Holiness Pope XII in 1950.

One series of the Turkish postage stamps commemorating the Assumption carries an illustration of the Blessed Virgin actually died in Jerusalem and was assumed into Heaven from that City.

### Tax Suit Test Decision Due

San Francisco.—(NC)—Decision on a test case challenging the constitutionality of California's "Proposition 3"—which exempts non-profit elementary and high schools from property taxes—will be announced July 20.

A suit charging that Proposition 3, as approved by California voters last November, violates the State constitution as well as the First Amendment of the Constitution of the U.S., was heard by three Superior Court judges of Alameda County.

Alfred J. Luchberg, chairman of the California Taxpayers' Alliance, who filed suit, said 64 persons have contributed to the support of his action, but did not reveal the names or the amounts contributed.

Witnesses at the hearing included Father James N. Brown, superintendent of schools for the Archdiocese of San Francisco, who testified that religious instruction averages 40 minutes a day in the parochial schools.

Queen Receives Papal Nuncio London (RNS)—Archbishop Fernando Cento, Papal Nuncio to Belgium and leader of the Papal Mission to the Coronation of Queen Elizabeth, was received privately by the British sovereign before his departure from here.

In a statement to the press, the nuncio said the Queen had expressed her appreciation of a letter he delivered to her from Pope Pius XII. He did not disclose the contents of the letter.

Archbishop Cento said the Queen told him that her own visit to the Vatican still lived in her memory. He added that Princess Margaret, the Queen's sister, also spoke of her visit to the Pope.

(As Princess, Queen Elizabeth visited Pope Pius XII with her husband, the Duke of Edinburgh, in April, 1961, while vacationing in Italy. Princess Margaret was received by the Pope in May, 1949.)
