

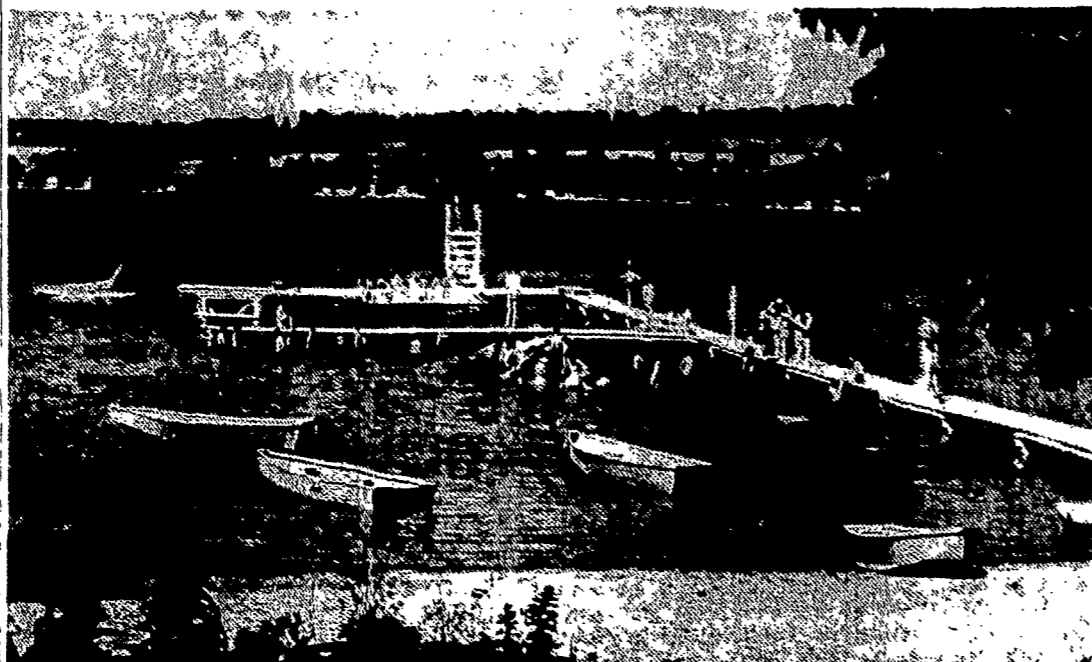

Organ To Be Installed In St. Stephen Church

Geneva — St. Stephen's Church will soon have a new pipe organ to replace the 44-year-old instrument now being used, according to the Rev. Raymond P. Nolan, pastor.

Plans for the new organ were made by the late Rt. Rev. Msgr. William H. McPadden, former pastor of St. Stephen's Church. Contract for the organ was signed Jan. 15, 1952, a year before Monsignor McPadden's death.

NEGOTIATIONS FOR the new organ were completed with Arthur A. Kohl, president of the Kohn Organ Co., of Rochester, after determining some changes required to improve the tonal design, including the latest mechanical improvements.

The organ will be a 2-manual instrument with pedal manual of direct electric action type, a patented design invented by Kohl. It will have 15 ranks of pipes, all of which will be taken from the old organ, for a total of 952 pipes.

The new organ will be under expression as before being enclosed in separate chambers, one on each side above the altar. A new console with 15 stops will replace the old one.

St. Stephen's Church designed in a modified Gothic architecture has been a beautiful landmark in downtown Geneva for many years.

BLESSING OF THE new organ and a dedicatory service will be held soon after installation has been completed, according to Father Nolan. James Lynch is organist.

An erecting crew, under the personal direction of Kohl, and assisted by David V. Gagner, at one time with Casavant Freres of St. Hyacinthe, Quebec, well-known Canadian organ manufacturers, have already started to dismantle the old organ to make room for the new one.

It will take about three weeks to complete the erection, according to Kohl.


