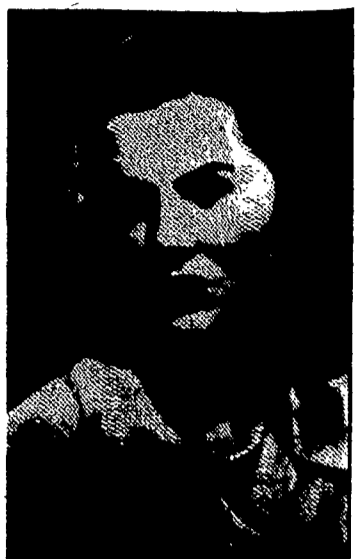

### Polio Aid Merits Award For Wehle

Louis A. Wehle, Chairman of the Board of the Genesee Brewing Co., Inc., Rochester, received an Award of Merit from The National Foundation for Infantile Paralysis in recognition of his service as New York State Chairman of the March of Dimes. Mr. Wehle has just completed his tenth consecutive year as head of the state's fund raising group.

The award was made at a luncheon meeting of the Foundation's executive staff at The Rochester Club, by Ernest Frost, Northeastern Regional Director representing Basil O'Connor, President of the organization.

In an informal talk after accepting the award, Mr. Wehle praised the work of the Foundation and commented upon the fine work that organization has done particularly in organizing the mass inoculation clinics in Chemung and Steuben Counties of New York State, where 35,000 children received gamma globulin injections in two days. This was made possible by the cooperation of the State Health Department, local doctors and dentists, Red Cross, Civilian Defense, and other volunteer workers.

### 2 Missionaries Returning To Ireland On Visits Here

They are the Rev. Seamus Skeeran, a former missionary in South Africa whose home is in Kilkenny, Ireland and the Rev. Maurice Kavanagh, C.M. here to visit relatives.

Father Kavanagh visited at the home of his cousin, Patrick J. Kavanagh, 25 Oriole St. Re-counting again his trials as a prisoner of the Chinese Reds, the Vincetian priest said Americans are not as keenly aware of the danger of Communism as they should be.

He said the "only assurance against the threat of the Reds is to keep organizations alerted to its dangers."

Father Skeeran was a guest at the Irish American Field Day conducted by the Monroe County Ancient Order of Hibernians and Auxiliary at Scheutzen Park, Sunday. He told the Hibernians and their guests that the "United States is a nation of which to be proud."

One of the eight resident physicians adding to their medical knowledge at St. Mary's Hospital is one who looks forward not only to carrying on his work in the Philippine Islands but also to being reunited with his family of wife and six fine children, now residing in Luzon.

Father Guttenberger Marks Silver Jubilee. Rev. Charles M. Guttenberger, Joseph's Church, Rochester from C.S.S., who was rector of St. Joseph's Church, Rochester from 1945 to 1949 celebrated the 25th anniversary of his ordination at St. Philomena's Church, Pittsburgh, where he has been stationed since leaving Rochester.

AMERICAN DOCTORS and hospitals are not new to him because in 1944 he was attached to American Hospital 118 in Leyte and used his skill for four months with the wounded G.I.s. He said he learned American ways during that period.

Prior to that time, Dr. Fuentes was assigned to the Leyte Provincial Hospital for a year. After World War 2, in 1946, with his two brothers who are also doctors, he reopened an old hospital in Tacloban.

In 1952 the Filipino surgeon and his brothers had their own hospital of 25 beds.

After his year of residence at St. Mary's Hospital, Dr. Fuentes plans to tie himself away from the Philippines again to be reunited with his family and to bring the added medical and surgical knowledge he has gained to his people.

Novena in 54th Year. New Orleans—(NC)—The 50th novena to St. Ann since the establishment of St. Ann's shrine in St. Ann's Church here has been scheduled. Each day of the novena, which will end on the Feast of St. Ann, July 26, there will be five services.

### 800,000 Children Join Camp Plan

Vatican City—(NC)—An estimated 800,000 Italian children of underprivileged families are expected to spend vacations at seaside and mountain camps this summer under a program sponsored by the Pontifical Aid Committee at the express wish of His Holiness Pope Pius XII.

A report in Osservatore Romano said that work was progressing at more than 4,000 camps to assure adequate facilities for the care of the youngsters. Besides the usual recreational attractions, the camps will be equipped to carry on programs of educational aid.
