

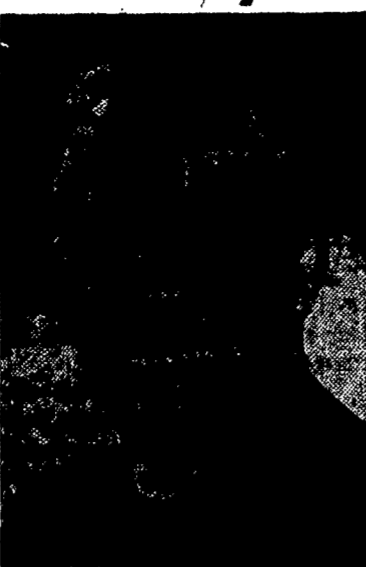
3 Basilian Fathers Come To Join Men's College Faculty

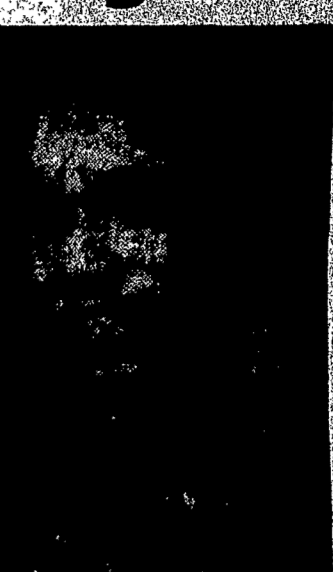
