WHAT is it that arrests your attention in each of these God Love You's? It is the absence of moderation, the commonplace, the ordinary. Ancient Greek wisdom recommended never doing too much, never doing too little—"just a happy medium". Fr. Peyton To Speak At Geneva Club

Geneva—The Rev. Patrick Peyton, C.S.C., world famous for his promotion of Family Prayer and the Family Rosary will speak to a group of Genevans at Club 96 Tuesday, July 28, at 7 p.m. On his former visit here he attracted a throng for his address on the Rosary.

Father Peyton has recently returned from successful Rosary Crusade rallies in England and Spain. He is expected to be in Rochester on Tuesday noon. After two weeks in New York he will go to Australia and Japan to carry on his program encouraging recitation of the Rosary individually and in family and neighborhood groups, daily.

A member of the Holy Cross Fathers community, Father Peyton has been engaged in his work of conducting rallies, radio and television broadcasts since 1942. After recovering from tuberculosis, he made a resolution when ordained in 1941, to restore the Family Rosary to ten millions of homes in America because he believes that it was the Blessed Mother's intercession that helped in his recovery.

Easter and Christmas broadcasts on national radio and television hookups have followed the first in May 1945 in which His Eminence Cardinal Spellman participated. Millions have heard and viewed the broadcasts.
