4th Degree Session Opens Claver Knights Convention

The Conclave of the Fourth Degree, Knights of St. Peter Claver that will be convened at 4 p.m. on August 1 at Hotel Seneca, will open the 38th National Convention of the order and will mark the first time that a National Convention composed mainly of colored Catholic members has met in Rochester.

Sir Knight Orlando J. Greene of Corpus Christi Parish is the official host of this division which is the highest degree in Claverism.

MEMBERS OF this Degree are privileged to wear the sword, baldric and cape, and are styled "Sir Knight." To merit initiation in this degree, one must have been a member in the Third Degree for at least four years and performed some outstanding service for the Church or the Order.

Sir Knight Greene holds the distinction of being the only Third Degree member in New York State at the present time.

Back in 1935, Mr. Greene was active in establishing what was then known as the St. Peter Claver Society and served as its first secretary.

When an opportunity presented itself in 1948, Mr. Greene recruited enough men to obtain a Charter from the Knights of Peter Claver, organized the Blau-Bernard J. McQuill Council #106 in Rochester and was elected its first Grand Knight. In 1949 he recruited sufficient members among the ladies to obtain a Charter for the Auxiliary and his wife, Mrs. Francis J. Greene

Father Hogan Heads DeSales High In Geneva

Geneva.—The Rev. Joseph L. Hogan, M.A., S.T.D., is the new principal of De Sales High School, succeeding the Rev. Raymond P. Nolan, pastor of St. Stephen's Church.

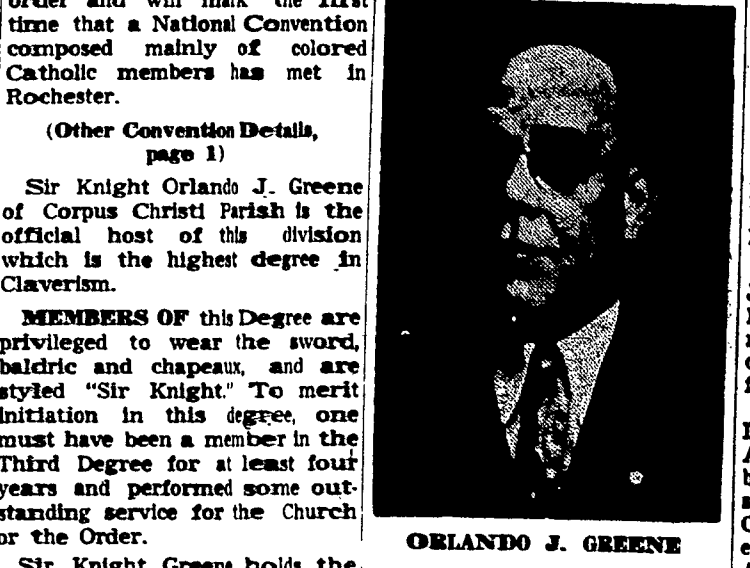
Dr. Hogan was educated in St. Rose's School, Lima, his hometown, and in Lima High School. He is a graduate of St. Andrew's Preparatory Seminary and St. Bernard's Seminary, Rochester.

OBTAINED TO the priesthood June 6, 1942, by His Excellency Bishop Kearney, his first assignment was assistant to the pastor of St. Mary's Church, Elmira, from 1942-45.

He was appointed professor of Latin and Social Studies at St. Andrew's Seminary in September 1945. He later did graduate study in history and education at Canisius College in Buffalo and earned the degree of Master of Arts in May, 1949, and he was a teacher at Canisius College Summer School in 1949.

Dr. Hogan was assigned to graduate study in theology at the Pontifical University Angelicum in Rome, Italy, in Sept. 1949, and was awarded the doctorate degree in Sacred Theology in May, 1951.

He was appointed professor of Latin and Religion at St. Andrew's Seminary in Sept. 1951, and was chairman of the Department of Theology at St. John Fisher College, Rochester, 1951-June 1953.

As a reward for his organizational activity on behalf of the Knights of St. Peter Claver, Greene was appointed an Area Deputy for New York State.

FOR MANY YEARS he has been an active member of Corpus Christi Holy Name Society serving as secretary in 1951. He has been a member of the Nocturnal Adoration Society since 1948. For ten years, he has been active in Scouting, serving on the Troop committee for five years, on the Pack committee one year as member, two years as Chairman and for the past year has been Institutional Representative and in charge of all branches of Scouting activity in the Parish.

Recommended as a model Catholic Layman by his pastor, Greene was accepted and initiated a "Sir Knight."

The nearest Assembly of Sir Knights is located in Detroit and it is to this unit that Sir Knight Greene belongs but he is now looking to the day when he can recruit enough candidates to form an Assembly in Rochester.

Batavia Downs Opens Monday

Batavia, N. Y.—Batavia Downs rich stake program will get off to a rousing start during the first week of the 78-night meeting which opens Monday, Aug. 3, when \$17,000 is distributed to money winning horses in five early closing events.

The inaugural, a \$2,000 nineteen class pace program will open in the 12-year history on opening night. The \$2,000 Finger Lakes Trot on Wednesday will bring together a well-matched field of 24-class trotters.

On Thursday and Friday Batavia patrons will get a glimpse of some of the country's outstanding 2-year old trotters and pacers in the Downs Colt & Filly Stake No. 2. The Juvenile Trot is scheduled for Thursday with the Pace following on Friday night. Both events carry a purse value of \$5,000.

The opening week's stake card will be climaxed on Saturday night with the \$3,000 Wyoming, a 14-class trot. Sixteen speedsters have been named for this feature which will be highlighted by the 1953 Batavia debut of Syndicator, the consistent black horse from the Garland Garney stable.

Trotting sensation of the Western New York circuit this season, Syndicator has not been out of the money in 16 starts to date.

The Catholic Society of SS. Crocifisso was reorganized on April 8, 1951 and having existed from 1914 to 1944. After three years in Cornell University Medical College, he transferred and was graduated from Queens University in Kingston in 1908. He opened his practice in Rochester in 1910 and joined the staff of St. Mary's at that time.

A member of the American Medical society and of county and state associations he was also a charter member of Brook-Lea Country Club.

Surviving are his wife, Mrs. Maude Doyle Quinn; a brother, Leo of New York City; three sisters, Mrs. Frederick Kraeuter, Detroit, Mich.; Mary Quinn and Mrs. Florence Waddington.
