Courses In Polio Care Given 85 Elmira Nurses

In order to have a group of graduate nurses trained in the care of Poliomyelitis, an intensive course on procedure and care for polio patients was conducted at St. Joseph's and Arnot-Ogden Hospitals in Elmira beginning on Thursday, July 23, and concluding Wednesday, July 29.

About 85 nurses attended the classes. Of this number 50 took the course of instruction at St. Joseph's and 35 at the Arnot-Ogden.

THE CLASSES at the Arnot-Ogden were two hour sessions held in the afternoon. Those at St. Joseph's were also two hour sessions and were held in the evening.

The first session included a lecture on the nature of the disease given by Doctor William Phillips and a discussion on the nursing care as related to minimizing the after effects of Polio. This talk was given by Miss Jennie Rolandi, Supervising Physician Therapist of New York State Department of Health.

The second meeting was a continuation of the discussion of nursing care of Poliomyelitis and was also given by Miss Rolandi.

The third class included discussion and demonstrations on Isolation Technique to be observed in the care of polio patient. This class at the Arnot-Ogden Hospital was given by Miss Joan Cunningham, Nursing Arts Instructor at that hospital and at St. Joseph's the class was given by Mrs. Virginia Holcombe, Clinical Instructor in Pediatrics.

The fourth and final meetings stressed the care of the patients in respirators including suction methods, oxygen administration, and hot packs. These classes were conducted by the Red Cross Nurses now engaged in the care of Polio patients at the two hospitals. These nurses have had special training and experience in the nursing care of all types of polio patients.
