In the Gold Coast CANANDAIGUA LAK E: St. KING FERRY: All Saints, out of 3,008 schools 1,111 are Catholic. As a result of Communist persecution in China, the Britisch Colony of Hong Kong in a few years has about two million re-fugees, over 90,717 of whom are destitute. Hong Kong has only an area of 390 miles and is five-sixths mountainous. The Jurak Bay area alone out of this number has had 1,220 baptisms. The burdens laid on the missionaries in Hong Kong is beyond our powers of comprehension in this land of plenty

The missionary picture of Uganda is brighter. The Flducation Committee, recently stated: "We are unanimous in our conviction that education in the fullest sense must have a religious basis."
