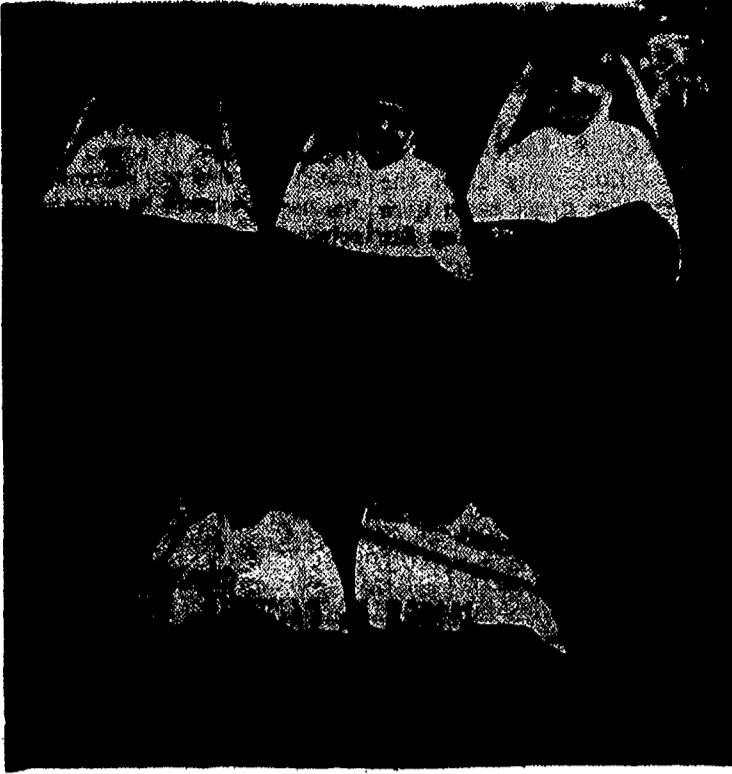


SILVER JUBILARIANS
