**Benedictine Chapel
Blessing On Sunday**

The only Benedictine Monastery in New York State will be the scene of centuries old religious ceremonies and tradition when the newly constructed chapel in honor of Our Lady Queen of Peace is blessed and the first Mass sung in it on Sunday, August 16, at Mount Saviour Monastery, near Elmira.

The Benedictine Monks, who opened Mount Saviour in the Spring of 1951 on a 500 acre tract of land in the rolling farm country outside Elmira, will welcome hundreds of friends from New York and other Eastern states to the ceremonies which mark the first major step in the planned development of an entire Monastery building.

THE CHAPEL will be blessed by the prior of the Community of Monks, Very Reverend Damasus Winzen, O.S.B. Although not fully completed, construction has reached the stage where religious services can now be held for a congregation and the monks were anxious to open it for visitors as soon as possible.

On Saturday, August 15, the last High Mass will be sung in the little chapel which the monks have been using in the farm house they now occupy as the monastery.

At this Mass two of the novices, Brother Maur Laforet of Boston and Brother Paul Schretlen of New York, will take their vows. The rest of the day will be spent in moving into the new Chapel of Our Lady of Peace which has been under construction during the past twelve months.

Despite the lack of adequate living quarters for themselves, the monks of Mount Saviour considered the erection of a Chapel to be a matter of the utmost priority. Discussing the future building plans of the monastery in 1952, the Very Rev. Damasus Winzen, O.S.B., prior of the community stated, "The first structure will be a chapel to be followed by a wing of the monastery. We promised that if Our Lady would help us get the site, our first building project would be a chapel dedicated to God's glory under her patronage as 'Queen of Peace'."

Brother Lipinski will arrive in Rochester late in August to visit his parents. He will leave for Italy on Sept. 18.

**House Raises
Pay Of Chaplain**

Washington, D.C. — (RNS) — The House voted unanimously in one of its final acts before adjournment to raise the pay of its chaplain, Dr. Bernard Bras-kamp, from \$3,000 to \$4,250 a year.

Rep. Karl LeCompte (R-Iowa), who introduced the measure, and Rep. Edward Garmatz (D-Md.) pointed out that Dr. Braskamp has made the post a full-time job since becoming House chaplain three years ago. The 66-year-old chaplain is the dean of the Presbyterian clergy in the nation's capital.
