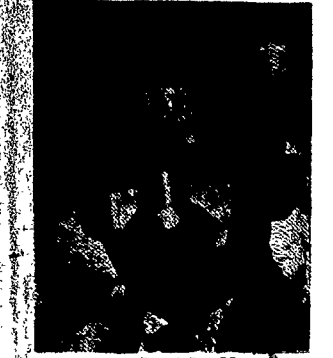

Sentimental Hymns Scored As Weakening Devotion

Cincinnati, (NC) — An American authority on Church music declared here that sentimental hymns tend to weaken the religious spirit and cited several long-time popular hymns as bad examples of Church music.

Father Richard B. Curtin, professor of Church music at Dunwoody Seminary, Yonkers, N. Y., principally criticized hymns that place "undue emphasis on the human nature of Christ."

As one bad example, Father Curtin cited the hymn "Good Night Sweet Jesus." He said the hymn "may be all right for children," but should be considered too sticky for adults.

"And the melody should be composed for the average person in the pews," he continued. "It should be comfortable and neither stilted nor common. And you should not have to be both a soprano and a bass at the same time in order to sing it."

As examples of hymns that deserve to be sung in Church, Father Curtin cited "Holy God," "O Sacred Heart," "O Come, O Come, Emmanuel," and "Creator of the Stars of Night."

Named National K. of C. Leaders

KC Leader Lays Luke Hart Named Supreme Knight At KC Convention

St. Paul, Minn., (NC) — Luke E. Hart, St. Louis attorney, was elected Supreme Knight of the Knights of Columbus, to succeed Judge John E. Swift of Boston, at the organization's 71st annual convention here.

Judge Swift, who served as Supreme Knight since 1943, announced before the balloting began that he wished to retire from office. Hart has served the organization as Supreme Advocate for the last 31 years.

THE DELEGATES voted to hold the 1954 convention in Louisville, Ky. Resolutions approved by the convention advocated: The insertion of the words "under God" after the words "one nation" in the pledge of allegiance to the flag so as to give recognition to the "Source of all lawful authority and of the inalienable rights of men."

Restoration of the name San Salvador to the island where Columbus landed on his first voyage to the New World. The name of the island was changed to Watlings Island under British possession, and the view of the delegates was that this name is without significance.

Mr. Hart reported that since the K. of C. began its advertising program in 1948 it has received 1,296,236 inquiries to advertisements on the Catholic faith. It has published in leading magazines and newspaper supplements of the country.

THREE INQUIRIES, in turn, have resulted in 117,282 persons enrolling for Catholic instruction by mail. But, he continued, these statistics do not measure the total value of the advertising program.

"For," he explained, "they do not reflect how much good-will has been won, how many anti-Catholic rumors have been stamped out, how many delinquent Catholics have been moved to resume the practice of their faith, or the number of people who have been influenced to go directly to a parish priest for baptism as a result of reading a Supreme Council ad."

Ousted Missioners Win U. S. Entry New York, (NC) — Eight Hungarian-born missionaries expelled from Red China have been granted permission to take up work in the United States.

They arrived here under the sponsorship of Father Julian Pitzer, commissary provincial of the Franciscan province of St. John Capistran, with headquarters at Roebling, N. Y.

Two of the missionaries are Franciscan priests; three are Franciscan Brothers, and three are Sisters of Mercy. They were ousted from Red China a year ago for alleged "spying for the United States" and stayed in Hong Kong until receiving permission to enter the United States.

Boston To Build Railroad Chapel Boston—(NC)—Boston already has Our Lady of the Airways Chapel at Logan Airport for the accommodation of plane passengers flying in and out of the city. It soon will have a chapel to accommodate the thousands who pass through its principal railroad station.

It has been announced that Archbishop Richard J. Cushing has approved the new chapel, which will be located in the South Station and will be known as Our Lady of the Airways Chapel. The announcement said the chapel will be larger than the one at the airport and will be located near the station waiting room.
