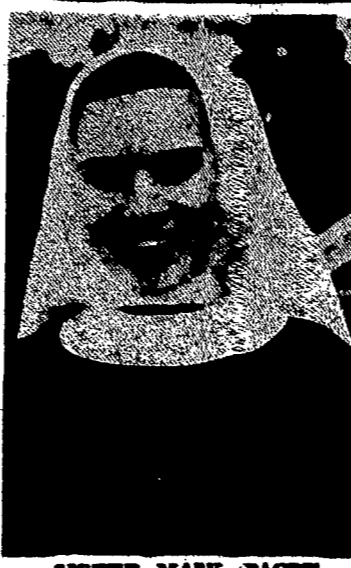

Four Catholic high school students will enter Rochester Business Institute on scholarships awarded by the school when the fall term opens on Sept. 1.

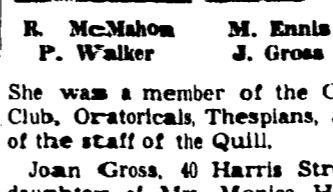

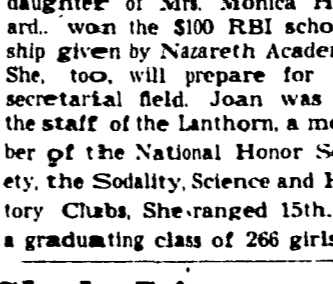

First Friday Club Lists Father Murphy, Chaplain

Rev. Donald J. Murphy, chaplain of St. Mary's Hospital, will be the First Friday Luncheon Club speaker at Sheraton Hotel, Friday, Sept. 4, it was announced at the Knights of Columbus office, today.

An Army chaplain veteran, Father Murphy will be presented by the Rev. Raymond G. Heisel, club moderator and chaplain of Rochester Council, Knights of Columbus and also an Army chaplain veteran.

Father Murphy during World War 2, served two years overseas in action in France with the 90th Infantry, 357th Division. He was awarded the Silver Star for action in the French campaign and the Bronze Star also for meritorious action in July 1944.

ORDAINED in 1937 he was an assistant pastor of Immaculate Conception parish before enlisting and was later on the faculty of Aquinas Institute for several years.

While in Europe Father Murphy had a memorable visit with Theresa Neumann, the famed stigmatic, at her bomb-riddled home at Konnersreuth in Bavaria. Catholic men who have received Holy Communion on the First Friday are eligible to attend the luncheon according to Chairman Lawrence V. Driscoll of the K. of C. sponsoring committee.
