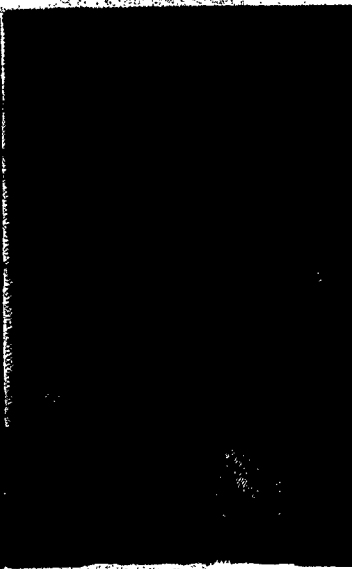

St. Bernard, patron of the Cistercians of the strict observance, commonly known as the Trappists, was honored on his Feast Day, August 20 by celebration of Solemn Pontifical Masses in Our Lady of the Genesee Monastery.

His Excellency Auxiliary Bishop Casey celebrated the Mass in the Monastery Chapel near Pittsford.

ST. BERNARD, the Rev. Joseph A. Cirincione, pastor of St. Francis of Assisi Church, Rochester and director of the Family Radio Rosary For Peace said, "was great with a three-dimensional greatest height—because approved by God and canonized by the church and declared a Doctor of the Church; breadth—in his activity."

Bernard ranged all over Europe and was called the man who carried the 12th century on his shoulders. Length his greatness has endured to our own day for Bernard is one of the immortals.

Paul S. Sisson received his commission in the United States Army at graduation exercises at the Infantry School at Fort Benning, Georgia, on August 4.

Lieut. Sisson, a graduate of Hobart College with the 1952 class, was inducted into the Army in August, 1952, trained at Camp Devens, Mass., and Fort Benning.

After a short visit with his parents, Mr. & Mrs. Paul S. Sisson, Sr., of Bridge St., Lt. and Mrs. Sisson with their three-month-old son, Mark, have left for Camp Claiborne, Arkansas, where he will be on Troop Duty for four to six months.

Mr. & Mrs. Joseph Poole of E. Bayard are expecting momentarily to receive word that their son, Corp. Joseph L. Poole, has arrived in this country after more than a year in the Far East. Joseph, who was beginning his Senior year at Hobart College, enlisted in the Army in September of 1951 and after several months of training graduated from the Counter-Intelligence Corps School at Fort Holabird, Maryland on June 6, 1952.

He sailed for the Far East on July 17, 1952 and after attending a Specialist's School at Etto Jimra in Japan, from which he was graduated with a superior record, assigned to the 24th C.I.C. Detachment. For the last few months he has been with the 441st C.I.C. in Social Japan. Under the rotation regulation, he is in line for return to the United States in the immediate future.

Lima Rites Held For James Malone. Lima James Malone, widely known Avon farmer, was buried in St. Rose Cemetery, Lima, Wednesday, August 19. Mr. Malone died August 15, 1953.

Mr. Malone member of a Catholic family, members of which were among the earliest settlers in Livingston County, was a life-long parishioner of St. Rose Church and a member of the Holy Name Society.

His grandparents families were among eight families who pledged all they had to found the Catholic Church in Lima.
