Father Tobin after six years at St. Joseph's Church, Rochester was leaving this week to take up his new duties as pastor of Our Lady of Perpetual Help Parish in Tampa, Fla.

In Rochester as a preacher at novena and mission services, and as a witty after-dinner speaker, Father Tobin had made a host of friends at the reception sponsored by Rochester Council, Knights of Columbus demonstrated.

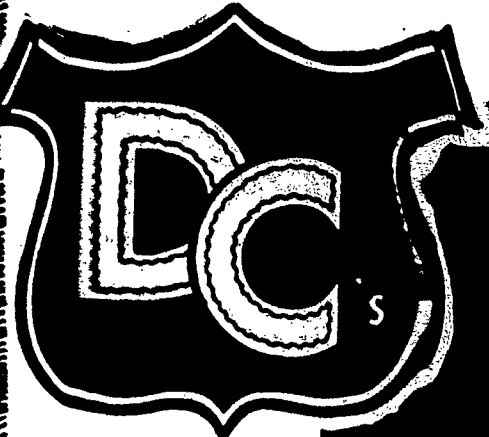

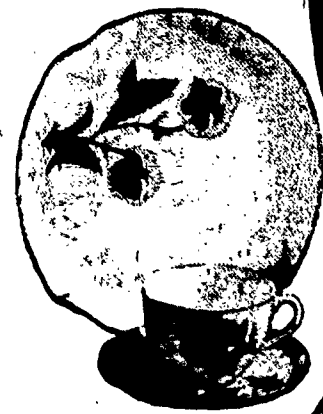
