Bishop Scully Named Chaplain Of State K. of C.

Coadjutor Bishop William A. Scully of Albany and pastor of St. Mary's Church, Troy has accepted the post of State Chaplain of the Knights of Columbus according to State Deputy Denis A. Mansfield.

Bishop Scully was born in New York City, August 6, 1894. He attended St. Joseph's Seminary, Yonkers and was ordained at St. Patrick's Cathedral, New York on Sept. 20, 1919.

In 1920 he attended Catholic University and was assistant pastor of Sacred Heart Church, New York from 1920 to 1926 at which time he became pastor and continued in that capacity until 1940.

DURING THE years 1940 to 1946, Bishop Scully held the position of Secretary of Education of the Archdiocese of New York. He was named a Domestic Prelate with the title of Right Reverend Monsignor in 1943 by Pope Pius XII.

He was consecrated Titular Bishop of Pharusia and Coadjutor Bishop of Albany at St. Patrick's Cathedral, New York by Bishop Edmund F. Gibbons of Albany on Oct. 24, 1945.

Bishop Scully is also chairman of the New York State Catholic Welfare Committee and resides at 200 Washington St., Troy.

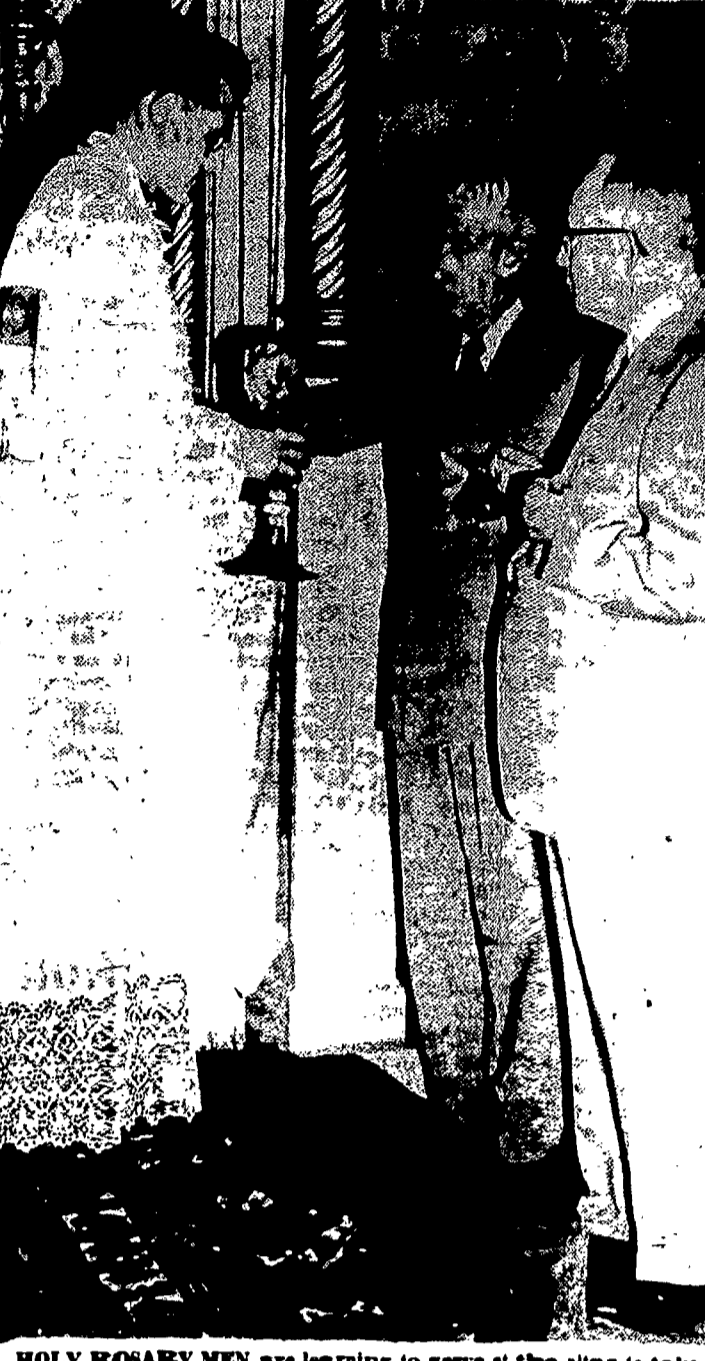
Garden Bazaar Set For Carmel

Labor Day Mass Slated At St. John's, Greece

A Mass will be offered on Labor Day at 9 a.m. in St. John the Evangelist Church, Greece honoring St. Joseph, the model of all workmen, and the heavenly patron of the Church's program for social justice according to the Rev. Donald E. Lux, pastor.

Celebrant of the Mass will be the Rev. Henry Atwell, Assistant Pastor at St. John's. Servers will be men of the parish representing management and labor. All parishioners and friends are invited to assist at the Mass.

A special leaflet Missal, prepared by the Catholic Labor Alliance of Chicago will be given to those who attend to enable them to follow the prayers said at the altar.

Pope Pius XII in May of this year urged the faithful to reflect on the spiritual meaning of Labor Day: "Who better than the true Christian can give to Labor Day a profound significance? For him it is a day on which he venerates and adores all the more intensely the Man-God Our Lord Jesus Christ, Who passed the greater part of His life as a humble worker to be our model, our consolation, and our sanctification; Labor Day is the day when the good Christian renews his promise to help create by the work of his mind and hands a culture that gives glory to God and brings man closer to God."

The leaflet Missal to be given at the Mass contains an introductory explanation of the Pope's plan for Labor Day, the text of the Mass, and a prayer to "Jesus the Carpenter of Nazareth," a prayer for working people.

IFCA Mission Group To Plan Activities

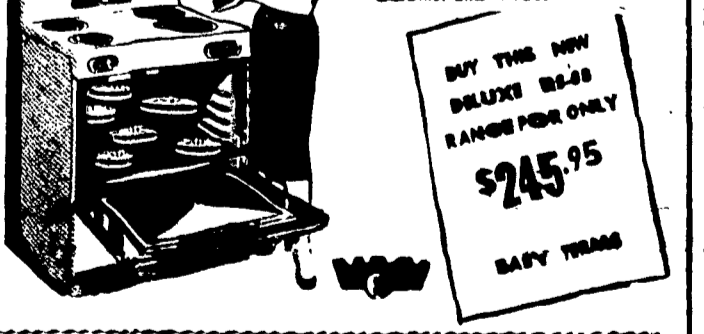
