### Bp. Kearney To Enroll Adorers At Holy Family

His Excellency Bishop Kearney will personally enroll Candidates in the Marianite Eucharistic League at Holy Family Church, Rochester, on Monday, Sept. 28. The Bishop will preside at the Reception and present each new member with the Adoration Medal to be worn at the hour of Adoration which each will promise to make every month in the presence of the Blessed Sacrament.

The sermon will be preached by the Bishop, who recently canonically established this local unit of the People's Eucharistic League at Holy Family. At present 265 parishioners who have indicated their desire to be enrolled are being contacted by charter members of the Society. They will receive copies of the Society Manual and instructions for their participation in the Reception program. Sole requirements for membership in this organization are the enrollment and the serious promise to spend at least one hour each month in adoration before the Blessed Sacrament. No special public services are held for the members, but each Adorer is expected to make his monthly Holy Hour at his own convenience. However, it is being suggested that families and small groups of friends and neighbors band together in carrying out their pledge. Business meetings will be held on the last Monday of each month, but attendance at these is not obligatory for membership. At these meetings Eucharistic topics will be discussed and other Eucharistic projects will be conducted. It will be the aim of the Society to increase, through its members, daily Communion, attendance at Mass and Visitation of the Blessed Sacrament, to bring lapsed Catholics back to the Sacraments and tepid souls to a more frequent use of them.
